Sugar, the produce of the British possessions, 100 tons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Cocoa, 50 tons; half to be delivered in a fortnight, and the remainder in a fortnight afterwards.

Both will be exempted from the Customs' duties.
