Heir Catholick Majeffies are perf-fily recovered of their late Indipolition, and intend to go the next week to the Escurial to pais fime days there. On the 20th Inffant the Marquifs of Guevorra Covered the first time before the King as Grandce of Spain, under the Title of Conde de Onate, (that Honour descending to him by the Death of his Mother) at which Ceremony most of the Nobility affifted. On the 24th died the only Son of Don Pedro d'Aragen, a Child of about two years old, to the great grief of that Family. They write from Barcelona that the Marquis de Cogolludo having taken poffeffion of his Command of General of the Galleys of Naples, put immediately to Sea in pursuit of feveral Turkish Brigantins he had notice were lurking on that Coast, but they were too nimble for the Galleys. Here is much difcourfe of Effablithing a Company for the West-India Trade, in imitation of those in England and Holland, for the East Indies : The King, it's faid, intends to advance a Million to wards the Stock, whole Example it's hoped the Nobility and Rich Men of this Kingdom will follow. Genoua, Ottob. 28. This week arrived here the Mappy Return from Palermo. The Good-will Sailed two days agone for Manfredonia. The Advice and the Lyon are Lading, both bound for the Coaft of Spain. On Wednefday laft arrived here an Express from Paris, who, after a fhort flay here, continued his Journey for Rome. The French Men of War and Privateers have taken feveral Ships belonging to the Subjects of this Republick. The Genouefe Galleys are at Barcelona, but it's faid Orders have been fent for their return hither.

Venice, Oftob. 20. We have received the following Relation of the taking of *Prevefa* by the Troops of this State, and those of the Pope, *Maltha*, and *Tuscany*, making together about 4000 Men, besides 1500 Greeks:

General Morofini having refolved to attack Prefa, a place of great importance for the fecuring the Conqueft of St. Maura, fituated at the entrance of the Golfe of Arta (which it commands) ordered five Gallies, and fix Galleaffes to approach towards the Caffles called Gomenizze, which are almost in fight of Prevefa, to amufe the Enemy, and to oblige them to divide their Troops, by fending reinforcements thither ; which had the fuccefs the General proposed to himfelf; for Saban Bacba believing the Venetians would attack those Caffles, fent thither greatest part of the Troops he had drawn together for the fecurity of Prevefa. The 20th of September the whole Fleet failed from Damata, and in the Evening came to an Anchor at the entrance of the Golfe. The 21. Captain Manetta with 24 Barks, and feveral armed Brigantines en-

tred the Golfs, and landed with part of our Troo; s the Turks firing at them both great and Imall thot but without doing them any harm. The Gallies at the fame time advanced within Musket that of the place to make a diversion, and to facili ate the dilembarking of part of our Troops, which having advanced by Land, patied in Galliots an arm of the Sca, about halfe a mile broad, Commanded by General strafoldo: The Turks belie-ving we defigued to land our Troops at the place where the Gallies had polted themfelves, employed their chief care on that fide to hinder it, but hinding their miltake, they fent in great halte seo Spahres to charge our Troops that paffed the aim of the Sea abovementioned, but thefe were already in order of Battle, and received the Turks for well, that many of them were killed, and the reft fled in fo great diforder, that the greatest part of them could not get into the Town. The Christians advanced, and without any opposition posses themselves of a Hill near the place ; upon which the General (ent to funnion it ; The Governor sa-ban Bacha was gone to put himself at the head of a Body of Turks to objerve the Christians, believing they durit not undertake the Siege of Prevefa; and the Officer that commanded in his absence would not receive the Generals Letter, butfired upon the perfon that carried it. The 22, four pieces of Canpon and as many Mortars were landed ; and the next day above 300 Bombs were fhot into the Town, which burnt leveral Houles; and before hight we had difm unted all the Enemies Car non but one; hitherto we had but one Man killed and five wounded. The 24th we made a lodgment in the Ditch, and the Miner was put to the great Tower of the place towards the Terra firms; that night twenty Turks made a Sally, and fürprized fome of our Men, killed one, wounded another, and took a third priloner. The 25th and 27th, we advanced our works, the Enemy plying us very clofe with their small Shot, and Signior Bachili who commanded part of the Troops of Malha was killed; The 28th, the Mine being ready, and having made a confiderable breach with our Can-non, Orders were given for an Alfault; but the next Morning the Turks hung out a white Flag, and fent out five Deputies; they demanded the fame conditions that were granted to the Ga-rifon of St. Maura; but the General would allow them no other, than that thirty of the most confi-derable of the Garifon fhould march out with their Arms and Baggage, and the reft without Arms, taking with them what things they could carry; which the Turks were forced to fubmit to.

The 30th they marched our, being 200 Men, and were conducted to a place within four miles of Arta. We found in the Town 44 pieces of Cannon, 18 whereof are Braß, and shoot 50 pound Bullets, with a confiderable quantity of Ammunition and Provisions; There remain 1200 Inha,bicants in the place; The Republeck by this Congneg
