FELONY. -£50 REWARD.

HEREAS John Byron, lately master and part owner of the ship John Renwick, of London, which was engaged, in the year 1838, to carry out female convicts to New South Wales, was, on the 14th of November last, charged before the Sitting Magistrate at the Thames Police Court at Wapping, with having stolen and embezzled divers large quantities of Her Majesty's stores and provisions, put on board the said ship for the subsistence and use of the convicts and passengers; and, on the 21st of November, stood committed to take his trial, but was subsequently admitted to bail for his appearance at the Central Criminal Court, at the Old Bailey, at the then next session, which commenced on the 25th of November last; at which session two bills of indictment for felony, grounded on the said charge, were found against him: and whereas the said John Byron did not make his appearance at the said session, in consequence of which the recognizances of himself and his bail were ordered by the Court to be estreated, and the said John Byron hath ever since been at large:

The Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty hereby offer a reward of £50, to any person who shall give such information as shall be the means of causing the said John Byron to be apprehended, so that he may be brought to justice.
