PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for the appointment of convenient places for the holding of assizes in England and Wales," Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is empowered, from time to time, to order and direct at what place or places, in any county in England or Wales, the assizes and sessions under the commissions of gaol delivery, and other commissions for the dispatch of civil and criminal business, shall be holden;

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, and in exercise of the authority thereby vested in Her Majesty in that behalf, Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order and direct, that from henceforth the assizes and sessions under the commissions of gaol delivery, and other commissions for the dispatch of civil and criminal business, in and for the county of Mont gomery, shall be holden as follows, that is to say, at Newtown, in the said county, in the Summer, and at Welshpool, in the said county, in the Spring in every year:
