OTICE is hereby given (pursuant to the standing orders of the House of Lords), that it is intended to make an alteration in the line of one of the new roads proposed to be made by the trustees of the Newcastle-under-Lyme, Blyth Marsh, &c. Turnpike Roads, under the powers of a Bill now depending in Parliament, intituled "A Bill for improving the roads leading from Newcastle-under-Lyme to Blyth Marsh, from Cliff Bank to Shelton, from Fenton to Hem-heath, and from Shelton to Newcostle under-Lyme; and for making and completing certain new pieces of road to communicate therewith, all in the county of Stafford" (of the intention of making application to Parliament for which Bill, notice was given in the London Gazette, and in the Staffordshire Advertiser, in the month of November last, and was also affixed on the door of the Sessions-House at Stafford at the last Epiphany Quarter Sessions held for the county of Stafford, and of which new pieces of road plans were deposited ut the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the said egunty of Stafford in November last, and with the parish clerks of the parishes in which such new pieces of read were intended to be made, in December last), that is to say, it is intended by the said Bill to take power to make a new place of road, about four hundred yards to the westward of, and instead of, the new piece of road mentioned in the aforesaid notices, and shown on the said plans, as intended to lead out of another intended new piece of road leading from the church-yard of the parish of Stoke-upon-Trent to Endon-Tollgate, at or near a point in the township of Shelton, at which the same will intersect the road making, or about to be made, from Shelton to Fenton, and to terminate in the road from Cliff Bank to Snape March, at a place lying opposite to the newly opened road called, or intended to be called, Chasterley-street; and which altered line of road is intended to commence and lead out of the same intended new piece of road leading from the churchyard of the parish of Stoke-upon-Trent to Endon-Tollgate, at a point near to the occupation road lead-ing from Trenthay form to Shelton, and to pass wholly through lands in the parish of Stoke-upon-Trent,

and township of Shelton, and to terminate near to a cottage in the holding of John Knight, in another of the aforesaid intended new pieces of read, namely, in the intended new piece of road leading from Shelton-wharf to the eastward of Fowley-prook,
