Madrid, November 23.

He 16th Inflant the King went to the Efcurial to Hunt, and returned hither again the 21. the ill weather bringing his Majelly back fooner than he intended. The 14th was publifthed here the Truce between the

two Crowns; And orders have been fent for doing the like in all the Ports and Frontier places of this Dun Ferdinando Escovedo. Grand Pilor Kingdom. of Castille (which Dignity was formerly posselled by Don Fean of Aultria) had the laft week Audience of the King before whom he covered for the first fime as Grandee of Spain. The Letters from Cadiz give an account that the Spanish Men of War that were defigned to go and meet the New Spain Fleet, were laid up again, to fave that expense. From Barcelona we have advice, that the Capitana of the Gallies of Naples, of which the Marquis de Cogolludo is General, was in a great florm caft away in that Road, and that of above 300 Perfons, who were on Board, only 26 were laved; but by good for-tune the Marquis de CogoBudo was athore: This This unhappy accident happened thus; The Capi-tana was faffned to the Body of a Vellei that had been purposely funk, but the violense of the Tem-pest making it float, beat it upon the faid Gally, which having got look, foon after funk. Another of the Neopolitan Gallies received at the fame time a great deal of damage. The Gallies of Sicily, Sardinia, and Genoua are at Cadaques, having orders to fail with the first fair weather for Italy The Duke of Bournonville, late Viceroy of Gatafonia, is arrived at Saragoffa in his way hither; The King has made him Chancelor of the Supreme Council of Flanders, (which Place hath been vacant for fome years) with a yearly Pention of 12000 Ducats; But it's faid he defires to retire.

Vienna, November 29. All our Advices from the Ottoman Territories affurous, That the Turks make very great preparations for the next Campagne; That they have in a manner emptied their Garifons in Afia to employ the Troops on this fide; And that they will bring great numbers of Men into the Field; But while the Enemy is thus build we are not idle here; All poffible endeavors being used to bring such an Army into the Field the next Summer as may repair the misfortune of the laft. The Elector of Bavaria hath promifed the Emperor that he will have 18000 Men of his own Troops in Hungary the next Spring, and that He will provide Artiflery and Ammuni-tion proportionably. It's faid the Elector of Co Jogne will likewife affift the Emperor with 12009 Mcn; The Bishop of Wirtsburg with 4000; The Circle of Franconia with 5 or 6000; And their good examples it's not doub ed will be followed by the reft of the Princes of the Empire. The Duke of Lorrain is still at Presbourg, ordering the Winter-quarters, but will be here in few days; The Imperial Troops fuffer very much in their march, the ways being extremely broken by the ill weather; and Provisions not very plentiful; Several Regiments which are reduced to a very fmill number will be reformed, and the Soldiers put into other Rodiesi General Schultz has taken a small place in Upper Hungary called Dinavez, which was furrendred upon Articles ; And it's lill

faid he has a defign upon Efperies; but a great deal of Snow having fallen, and the weather growing very cold, it's thought he will be obliged to defer the execution of it, till a more convenient time. Very firict Orders have been published in all the Heredicary Countries against the Exporting of Corn or any other Provisions. The Baron Lies rowski is gone for Poland to refide there is Euroy Extraordinary from the Emperor; the Count de Wallafhain, the Imperial Ambassador, having leave to return home. The Emperor hath named the Sicur Seiler to go for France in the quality of his Refident.

Ratisbonne, December 7. The Elector of Ba-varia parted from Vienna the 30th of the laft month for Municke & Is is reported that his Marringo with the Arch-Durchefs Maria Antonia, the Emperer's Daughter, is concluded; And that it will be confummated when his Electoral Highnels returns to Fienna in the Spring. A great Council of Wat will be held at Fienna, fo food as the Duke of Lorrain arrives there, to examine the whole Conduct of the Siege of Buda; The ill fucces whereof is chiefly attributed to the divisions in the Army, and the difunion among the Generals. Our Leis ters from Hungdry give an account that the Seralquier Balla after having given the nocellary orders for the repairing the Fortifications of Buda, and supplying the place with Provisions, was retired to put his Troops into their Winter-quarters. That the Imperialitis have demolifhed Peft; but are fortifying Faceia and Ficegrad. And that the Duke of Lorrain had broken the Regiments of Crey and Lubomirski, and had put the Men into other Regiments.

Cologne, December 8. This City having refolved to affift the Emperor with fome Troops against the Turks, the Magisfrates are confidering how to raife the Moneys to maintain them, and it's believed they will agree upon a Tax of the hundred penny. The Elector of Cologne has let the Magisfrates of this City know, that he intends to be here about the middle of this Month and not to come incognito ashe has hither to done, but that he expects to be received by them with Ceremony as their Arch-Bifhop, and to refide in his own Palace. The Troops of the Circle are fill here, and our Magisfrates are defirous to have them flay fome time longer.

Brussels, Desember 12. The Count d'Erps and the Abbat of St. Michael who are holiages with the French for the payment of the Contributions of this Province, are returned hither from Dinant, to halten the remaining payments, two have been made already, and the third will not be due till the end of March, by which time they hope the fourth and last will be likewife ready, that fo they may be difcharged, having only liberty to come hither for a few days. The Letters from Liege of the 9th Inftant tell **b**s, the Count de Daun had made an agreement with the Elector of Cologne concerning the Troops he is to affift the Emperor with; that he parted from thence the 7th on his return to Fienna; And that Orders have been given to the Regiments of Count Emanuel de Furflemberg and of Major General Smartz, who are already received into tis Imperial Maj flies Scivice to take their Winter Quarters in the Ter. ritorics

rite ies of Aix le Chapelle, and the Country àlpoyning, that they may be ready to march in the beginning of the Spring for Lugary. That the Elector of Cologne would part from Liege the 15th or 15th of this Month; and that he had written to the Magnifrates of Cologne to give them notice of the time he intends to be there, that they may receive and treat him as their Archbishop. The Sicur Duffee his Electoral Highnefies Minifler in this Court is called to Leige to attend him before his departure from thence. The Marquis de Grana is, it's faid, continued in the Government of thefe Countrys.

Hague, December 12. The State of the War for the next year hath been brought before the States of this Province, and the Deputies have communicated the fame to their refpective Prinsi als to have their approbation of it. The Prince of Nafam Stadtholder of Frizeland and Groningen hath fi ce he came hither constantly a listed at the meeting of the Council of State; It's faid he will part from hence the next Week to re-turn to Frizeland. The Sicur de Lavergne Gover-nor of Devenier having quitted the fervice of this State to enter interthe-Emperors, there are feveral Pretenders to the Government of Deventer, which it's believed will be given to Colonel Win-bergen. They write from Hambourg that the Duke of Honouer hath promifed to put 6000 Men into the Emperors Service : and that befides these the Duke of Zell, the faid Duke of Hanouer, and the Duke of Wolfembuttel will jointly affift his Imperial Majefty with 8000 v en more. The States of Holland are adjourned till the 18th Inftant.

Paris, December 13. There is much di courfe of a Marriage between the King of Polands Eldeft Son, and Madamoifelle de Bourbon Grand-Daughtersto the Prince of Conde; And it's faid that King is fending hither a Solemn Embassie on this occasion. We have advice that the Truce between the two Crowns hath been published in all the Ports of Spain.

Colchefter, November 20. This day his Grace the Duke of Albemarle, (Recorder of this Town) brought hither the new Charter which His Majefty has been Gracioufly pleased to Grant unto this Corration; His Grace was met at the utmost bounds of the Town, by the Mayor, Aldermen, Affiftants and Common Council, and about 200 Free Burgeffes on Horfeback, the Town Officers attending them; His Grace was received with all the demonstrations of Joy, and thence they marched in an orderly manner, (the Musick playing before them) to the head Gate of the Town, where the Company alighted, and his Grace was pleas'd to come out of his Coach, and was received by two Companies of the Town Trained-Bands; from thence (the way being fpread with Colchefter Bays of Mr. Alderman Lawrence's for his Grace and the Company to walk upon, and the Moot-Halland Bay-Hall hung with the fame) his Grace processed on Four with the Mayor, Aldermen, Afliftants and Common Council to the Hall, the Bells Ringing, and the numerous Inhibitants of this populous Town, expressing their fatisfaction in continued Huzza's in the fireets. As foon as his Grace entred the high fireet, the Charter being carried by the Town Clerk bare headed before him, there were feveral great Guns (brought from on Ship board for that purpole) fired before the Hall, the like was done when the Charter entred the Hall. The Court being fate the Charfor was read, which ended the whole Body of the Free Burg fles, (with which the Hall was then crowded) cried God Save the King leveral times, and Mr. Most in the Name of the Mayor and

Commonalty gave his Grace thanks for his interceflion to the King in the obtaining this Charter; and did humbly beletch his Grace to affure his Majefly of their Loyalty and faithfulnefs to his Majeflies Service; then his Grace thanked them for their acceptance of what he had done for them, and encouraging them in their Loyalty, caufed the Mayor and other Officers to be Sworth, which ended his Grace and thole Gentlemen that came with him were treated at a noble Dinner prepared for their entertainment. After which the Kings and his Royal Highneffes Health were drank, the Guns again firing, and fo the day ended, with Bonefires, Ringing of Bells, and the general joy and acclamations of the People.
