Hague, December 12. The State of the War for the next year hath been brought before the States of this Province, and the Deputies have communicated the same to their respective Prinsignals to have their approbation of it. The Prince of Nassam Stadtholder of Frizeland and Gromingen hath fi ce he came hither constantly a listed at the meeting of the Council of State; It's faid he will part from hence the next Week to re-turn to Frizeland, The Sieur de Lavergne Gover-nor of Deventer having quitted the service of this State to enter interthe-Emperors, there are feveral Pretenders to the Government of Deventer, which it's believed will be given to Colonel Win-bergen. They write from Hambourg that the Duke of Honouer hath promised to put 6000 Men into the Emperors Service: and that belides these the Duke of Zell, the faid Duke of Hanouer, and the Duke of Wolfembuttel will jointly affift his Imperial Majesty with 8000 ven more. The States of Holland are adjourned till the 18th Inflant.

The Court being fate the Charter was read, which ended the whole Body of the Free Burg fles, ( with which the Hall was then crowded) cried God Save the King leveral times, and Mir. Mett in the Name of the Mayor and

Commonalty gave his Grace thanks for his intercession to the King in the obtaining this Charter; and did humbly beseich his Grace to assure his Majesty of their Loyalty and faithfulness to his Majellies Service; then his Grace thanked them for their acceptance of what he had done for them, and encouraging them in their Loyalty, caused the Mayor and other Officers to be Swory, which ended his Grace and those Gentlemen that came with him were treated at a noble Dinner prepared for their entertainment. After which the Kings and his Royal Highnesses Health were drank, the Guns again firing, and so the day ended with Bonesires. Ringing of Bells, and the general joy and acclamations of the People.
