## From Bandap December 8. 10 Oblirgsay December 11, 1684.

Naples, November 7.

His day was publiched here the Truce between the two Crowns. The Gallies of the Great Duke of *Tufcany* are kept in this Port by the ill weather; And the Officers are Treated by our Viceroy with great Civility; who hath offered to receive their fick Men into the Hofpitals of this City, and to fend them, when well, to *Legborne*. On Friday laft arrived here by Sea 350 Spanish Soldiers to reinforce the Garifons in the Calles here.

Rome, November 18. We have advice that the Pope's Gallies and those of Maltba, which have ferved in the Venetian bleet this Summer, are arrived at Mefina, having a great many fick Men on Board, Cardinal Pio had the last week another Audience of the Pope concerning the present state of Affairs in Hungary; We are told the Pope will affish the Emperor with fresh supplies of Money to forward the Preparations for the next Campagne.

Milan, November 22. The last week our Governor the Count de Melgar, was present at a teview of the Regiment of Swiffers lately raised by Colonel Beroldingen, which at the same time received a months Pay. They write from Turin that the Marriage of the Pfince of Carignan, Unkle to the Duke of Savoy, was carried to privately that it was not known at that Court till it was Confiummated. There is, we are told, a Treaty on four between the Crowth of France and the Duke of Martua.

Venice, November 25. On Monday arrived here a fm ll Veffel with Letters from General Morifini, giving an account, that the ill weather had not suffered him to execute his defigns upon the Fortiefs of Arts and fome other places in the Golf of that name ; That there were a great many fick Men in the Fleet; That Signior Moliko was come to Zant with the Men of War under his command in purfuance of the Orders he had fent him; And that he intended to return home with the Fleet fo foon as he had put Prevela into a poffure of defence. The last Letters from Dalmatia inform us, that the Preveditore-General Valier and the Prince of Parma were at Liefina, where is appointed the Rendezvous of the Troops ; Not having as yet made any attempt upon Caftel-Nevo, for that the contrary Winds and ill weather have kept Ge-neral Morofini from fending thither the Gallies and Galeaffes that are to flut up the place on the fda of the Sec. The Patriarck of Finite the fide of the Sea. hath promifed to give 3000 Ducats yearly to-wards the War against the Turks, and his Ex-

ample will be followed by the reft of the Clergy of this State. On Wednelddy laft the Senaror Zacharia Valareffo took poffeition with the ufually Solemnity of his new Dignity of Procurator of St. Mark.

Genoud, November 25. This week artived here the William and David, and the Mary, both Jadea with Cern from Tabareo, The Adventure, the Effex Merchant, and the Hanniball are ready to fail. The laft week parted from hence Signior Gio, Francefeo Brignole, Envoy Extraordinary from this Republick to the Pope, to d fire his Mediation on their behalf at the Court of France. The Gallies of this Republick were according to our laft advices at Barcelona, but had received their Orders to return hither, and thended to fail with the firft fair weather in company of the Gallies of Naples, Sieily, and Sardinie.

Cracow, November 16. The 9th Inflant the King of Poland arrived at Fawarow, being met there by the Queen. The Troops are marched to their Winter-quarters, which are appointed as near the Frontiers as conveniently may be; and thole Provinces that are freed from them, are to contribute in Money according to the Rule that was made the lift Year at Leopol. The Towns of Barr and Miedziboz are affined the Coffacks. The Palatin of Ruffia, Great General of the Cown, arrived the 7th of this mon hat Leopol, where the Deputies for the Diffribution of the Winter Bread are at prefent Affembled. The place for the meeting of the Dyet is not yet fixed, for that they ought to meet this time in Lithuania, which will be very inconvenient in the prefent Conjuncture, and therefore the King hath written to the States of Lithuania to have their Confent that the Dyet may be held at Leopol of Lublin, which it's not doubted they will agree to. The Venetian Ambalfador having received Orders to return home, is gone to Fawarow to take his leave of the King.

Ratisbonne, November 28, The 22. Inflant the Imperial Commissioners represented, by a Memotial, to the Stares of the Empire Allembled here, That they had in September [all demanded, in the name of his Imperial Majelly, their affiliance against the Turks; And that they had now received Orders to make field Inflances for that purpole, for that the danger with which pot only the Emperor's Hereditary Countries but all Germany is threatned by the Common Enemy, encreases daily; And that his Imperial Majest will not be able along to oppose the great Forces the Turks are preparing to bring into the Field the next Summer; but that if the Electors, Princes and States of the Empire do affish him according to the Example of their Predeceffors, it will be easter, under the Divine Protection, 50 repute this formidable Enemy.

Co, ogne, December S. The Troops of the Ele-Ctor of Brandenburgh in Garifon here, being about 400 Men, having received orders to march to Weld, the Officers were gellerday entertained by the Magiltrates at the Town-Houfe; and will begin their march on Monday or Tuesday next. They write from Heydelberg that the Elector Palatin had been very much indilpofed, but that he was pietty well again. The 13 Swifs Cantons Affembled at Baden the 17th of the laft month to deliberate among other things, upon the Propofals that have been made to them by the Emperor's Ambaffador concerning their affifting his Imperial Majelly with a Body of Men in the War he is now engaged in against the Turks. The last Letters from Vienna are of the 29th paft ; They only tell us, that the Troops were everywhere going into their Winter-quarters; That great Preparations were making for the ' next Campagne ; And that most of the Princes of the Empire would affift his Imperial Majefty. That the Elector of Bavaria was returned to Municke; the Marriage between him and the Arch-Dutchefs the Emperor's Daughter, being look'd upon to be as good as concluded; And that the Duke of Lorrain was in few days expected at Vienna.

Hamburg, Decemb. 7. The last Letters from Warfaw fay the King of Poland had appointed the Senate to meet at Cracow, to confult with them about fixing the time and place for the meeting of the Dyct. And that the Polish Troops and those of Lithuania Wc were marching to their Winter-quarters. are told from Berlin that the Emperor hath written to the Elector of Brandenbarg to defire his affiflance against the Turks.

Mamburgh, Decemb, 12. They write from Dantzicke, that they had an account of the King of Po. land's arrival at Fawarow; That the Army was feparated, and the Troops matching to their Winter-quarters., That the Letters from Moleowy faid the Endeavors which have been used to induce the Czars to enter into the Alliance against the Turks, have not had any fucces, and that the Ministers that have been employed therein, are therefore leaving that Court. We are told from Zell that the Sieur Chauver is to command the Troops with which the Princes of Lunenburg have promifed to affift the Emperor.

Hague, Decemb. 15. The Court of Holland (which is the Supreme Court of Juffice in this Province) have caufed fuch of the Inhabitagts of the Town of Dort, who did not yield Obedience to the Summons of the Commissioners they lately fent thither, to be cited to appear before them the 18th Inftant here at the Hague. But the Magifirates of that City have forbid the faid Inhabitants to take notice thereof, and have promifed to Protect In the mean time the Deputies of Port in them. the Affembly of the States of Holland have complained of these Proceedings; Alledging that the faid Court hath no manner of Jurifdiction in matters of this nature; upon which the faid States have not as yet taken any final refolution. Prince Cafmir of Naffaw, Stadtholder of Frizeland and Groningen, parted from hence this week to return to Leewaerden, the place of his usual refi- 10 s. reward.

dence; but it's faid he will be here again very fuddainly. The Heer Van Citters, Amballador from this State in England, who came lately over to look after his priva e Affairs, will embark in two or three days in order to his return thither. The 13th Instant the Doputies of the States General had another Conference with the Ba. on Foel Ambaffador from the King of Denmark; concerning the Treaty of Commerce lately concluded between his Majelly and this State.

Paris, Decemb. 16. The Court continues fill at Verfailles ; but will it's faid remove from thence to St. Germain before the end of this month. The King has given to the Eldeft Son of the Count d'Effree, Vice Admiral of France, the Revention of that Office. The Count de Souffons is returned hither from Turin. The Chevalier de Chaumont, whom the King has appointed his Ambalfador to the King of Siam, has leave to choole 12 Gentlemen out of the Guards Marine to accompany him in his Embaffic.
