Madrid, December 7.

N unhappy business hath lately fallen out at Fuenterabia; The Cale as we have it; is thus; Five French Ships laden with Fish, being by stress of weather driven into that River, the Garison si ed at them, sunk one, and obliged the rest to put to Sea again in the extremity of a violent storm, in which they were all lost. Upon rotice here of an Alcalde de Corte was sent from hence to examine and chastise the Authors of this action, which happened feveral days after the publication of the Truce; and in the mean time we hear that the Prince of Chimay, who was coming hither from Flanders, is flopt by the Governor of Bayonne by way of Reprizal. On the 28th past the Duke of Bournonville, late Vice Roy of Catalonia, arrived here; and the fecond Inflant Killed the King's Hand. On the 29th the Dutch els Dowager of Lorrain, now Marri d to Count Mansfelds the Emperor's imballador at this Court, came hither with all They write from Alicant that on the oth past a finall English Pink came into that Road n four days from Argiers, by whom they had advice, That Mr Erlesman the English Consul, arrived there about the beginning of the last month; That the Centurion Frigat was gone for Tunis; And that three French Men of War had brought 400 Turks to Argiers to be exchanged for Christians, about which there had been some dispute, but that at last all was adjusted. We are extremely troubled here at the ill news we have from Germany concerning the Siege of Buda.

Maples, November 25. The 19th Instant parted from hence the Gallies of the Great Duke of Tufcany for Legborn, after having been detained several days in this Port by the ill weather. day arrived at Puzzole one of the Pope's Gallies called the St. Catherine, and the next 'morning the other four, having been in a great storm and much danger fince their departure from Melfina, the first Port they put into after their quitting the Venetian Fleet, which they lest off of Prevala. Our Vice-Roy having an account of the arrival of the said Gallies, sent an Officer to Complement the Commander of them, and to make him a Pre-

sent of fresh Provisions.

Naples, November 28. The Popes Gallies are still at Puzzole, being kept there by theill weather. Our Vice-Roy has received Orders from Spain to raife some new Troops; and has given out

Commissions accordingly.

Rome, December 2. On Wednesday last arrived here the Marquis Brignole Envoy Extraordinary On Wednesday last arrived from the Republick of Genoua; but has not yet had Audience of the Pope. Cardinal Bonvis, the Popes Nuncio at the Emperors Court, hath written, as we are told, in very pressing Terms to his Hol nels to pray him to quicken by his affifiance the Preparations for the next Campagne: And Cardinal Pio had the last week an Audience of his Holiness on the same subject. The Printer who was seized within the French Ambassadors quirter, by order

of the Inquiction, will, it's faid, upon his Excel-leacy's repeated Complaints; be fet at liberty. On Wednesday last arrived here the Arch-Bishop of Palermo, who is going for Spain, being named by his Catholick Majesty to be Bishop of Seville; He saw the Pope, and was very well received by him; and it's believed he will at the next Promo-

tion be made a Cardinal.

Genoua, December 2. The last week arrived here an Extraordinary Courier from Rome with Letters from the Popt to the Republick gi-The last week arriving them an atcount of the success his Mediarion on their belialf hath had at the Court of France, upon which the Little Counc I met several tim s, and the 30th past the Courier was sent back to The Great Council but been likewise allembled to confider of the French Proposits, but we do not hear that they have taken any final resolution therein, though it is a matter that admits not of much de'ay, for it's faid his Most Chilflian Majefly has declared, That if the Republick do not give him Satisfaction before the end of this month, he will be at liberty to make such new Demands as he shall think sit. The Count de Melgar Governor of Milan, has given the Republick great affurance of affiliance in tale they have need of ir. We have advice by the way of Legborn that the Gallies of Malta who have served this Summer in the Venetian Fleet, were returned home. French Privateers do greatly disturb our Naviga-tion, having taken of late several Ships belonging to the Subjects of this State. The Doke de San Pietro, Son in Law to the Marquis de los Balbaces,

is arrived here in his way to Rome.

Venice, December 9. The last week arrived here Venice, December 9. The last week arrived here near 200 Vessels of all forts, who came from the Levant and Dalmatia, to take in Provisions and other Necessaries for the Fleet and the Troops of this Republick; Py some of these we had advice, that Signior Molino, who hath Cruised all this Summer with a Squadron of 14 or 15 Men of War in the Archipelago, had lately been driven by a violent florm into the Gulf of Salonichi, where he had loft two of his Ships (the one called the Triumph and the other the Warrior) with most of their Men, among which was the Son of Signior Antonio Grimani Procurator of St. Mark, They write from Daimatia that the Proveditore-General Valier was advanced with the Forces of the Republick towards Narantaithat he had taken a Post of some consideration near that place; and that he was going to under-rake a more important Enterprize. The Preparations are continued here with great diligence for the next Summer; Twelve new Gallies are building in this Arfenal; and the Companies of the feveral frades of this City are to raife 1000 Men towards the Man-It's faid the Senate, among other ning of them. ways to raise Money, are del berating about encreafing the number of the Procurators of Sr. Marke, as was done during the War of Candia. and that those that come into these Supernumerary Places shall pay 25000 Ducats each. The Baron Degenfelde, who was formerly General of the Elector of Bavaria's Forces, is received into the Service of this State, and on Tuesday last had au Audience of the Senate to receive his Commission;

for the Service of the Emperor.

Bruffels, December 22. The Nations here have conferred to the Imposis upon Beer, &c. for fix months; and have likewile renewed the ordinary Duties upon the Consumption of Provisions; And the Marquis de Grana hath sent Orders to Newport and Oftend for the regulating the Customs upon Goods Imported and Exported, according to the Rates let in the time of the Prince of Parma, late Governor of these Provinces, which are judged to be very moderate: they write from Liege of the 19 Inflant that the 16 Chambers, established by the new regulation in the place of the 32 Trades or Companies, being Assembled, a supply of 800 thousand Crowns, had been demanded of them to reimburse his Electoral Highness the Charges he hath been at in reducing that City to it's Duty, and that it was told them several Merchants in Holland would advance that sum in case they would on the behalf of the Town give Security to pay the same in four years; but that the faid Chambers had answered that the City was not in a condition to gaile fo great a fum 5 The Letters add, that several of his Electoral Highness's Troops which were marching to their Winter-quarters, were ordered to return to Liege. The fast Letters from Vienna are of the to instant; They tell us that the Turks had made themselves Masters of Vaccia.
