Buckingham-Palace, November 21, 1840.

THIS Afternoon, at ten minutes before two, the Queen was happily delivered of a Princess. His Royal Highness Prince Albert, Her Royal Highness the Duchess of Kent, several Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and the Ladies of Her Majesty's Bed-Chamber, being present.

This great and important news was immediately made known to the Town, by the firing of the Tower Guns; and the Privy Council being as-

sembled as soon as possible thereupon, at the Council-Chamber, Whitehall, it was ordered, that a Form of Thanksgiving for the Queen's safe delivery of a Princess be prepared by His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, to be used in all churches and chapels throughout England and Wales, and the town of Berwick-upon-Tweed, on Sunday the 29th of November, or the Sunday after the respective Ministers shall receive the same.

Her Majesty and the young Princess are, God be praised, both doing well.
