High and Low Harrogate Improvements.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for an Act to repeal, alter, amend, and enlarge some of the powers and provisions of two several Acts of Parliament, one passed in the tenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for dividing and inclosing such of the open parts of the district called the Forest of Knaresborough, in the county of York as lie within the eleven constaberies thereof, and for other purposes therein mentioned;" and the other passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His said Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for reviving certain powers granted by an Act made in the tenth year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for dividing and inclosing such of the open parts of the district called the Forest of Knaresborough, in the county of York, as lie within the eleven constaberies thereof, and for other purposes therein mentioned," and by an Act of the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, for amending the said former Act, and for making the said two Acts more effectual;" so far as the same relate to the wells or springs of medicinal or mineral waters, commonly called Harrogate Spaws, and the stinted pasture, stray, or two hundred acres, respectively

situate in the several townships of Bilton-with-Harrogate, and Pannal, in the said forest of Knaresborough; and to obtain further and other powers and provisions instead thereof, for better protecting the said wells and springs of medicinal or mineral waters, and securing them from being destroyed, polluted, injured, or affected, and controlling the government, superintendence, usage, and management thereof; also for draining, levelling, planting, and otherwise improving the said stray or two hundred acres, and preventing and removing encroachments and nuisances thereon; and for more effectually securing the rights of the proprietors or owners of pasture gates, stray gates, or cattle gates, and of the visitors resorting to High and Low Harrogate, for the benefit of the said medicinal or mineral waters, and all other persons having occasion to use the same.

And notice is also hereby given, that it is intended to apply for power in the said Act, for paving, lighting (by gas or otherwise), watching, watering, draining, cleansing, regulating, repairing, widening, and otherwise improving the streets, roads, lanes, and other public passages and places, for establishing one or more public markets, and for removing or preventing nuisances, within such part of the several townships of Bilton-with-Harrogate, Pannal, Knaresborough, and Scriven-with-Tentergate, as are usually known or distinguished as High Harrogate, and Low Harrogate, and parts adjacent thereto respectively; and that it is intended to take power by the said Act to raise money for all or any of the aforesaid purposes, by levying a rate or rates, assessment or assessments, upon the owners and occupiers of tenements and hereditaments in High Harrogate, and Low Harrogate aforesaid, and parts adjacent thereto; or by borrowing money upon security of the said rates, or by some other means to be provided by the said Act; and so far as respects the improvements of the said stray, or two hundred acres, by increasing the number of pasture gates, stray gates, or cattle gates, and selling or disposing thereof; or allotting the same amongst the present owners thereof, or by some other means to be provided by the said Act.

And that the said stray, or two hundred acres, and the district or places called High Harrogate, and Low Harrogate, and parts adjacent thereto, intended to be included within the said Act, are situate within the several townships of Knaresborough, Scriven-with-Tentergate, Bilton-with-Harrogate, and Pannal, or some of them; and in the several parishes of Knaresborough, and Pannal, in the west-riding of the county of York.
