#### Barnstaple Turnpike Roads.

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session, for leave to bring in a Bill for extending the term, and altering and enlarging the powers, of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament, held in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for more effectually improving and keeping in repair the several roads leading to and from the town of Barnstaple, in the county of Devon, and for making

certain new lines of road to communicate with the same;" or for repealing the said Act, and granting further and other powers in lieu thereof
