RDERS for the Court's going into Mourning, to-morrow, Sunday the 20th instant, for Her late Serene Highness the Dowager Princess of Reuss Koestriuz, Great Aunt to Her Majesty, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk, fringed or plain linen, black gloves, necklaces and ear-rings, black or white shoes, fans and tippets.

The Gentlemen to wear black, full trimmed, fainged or plain linen, black swords and buckles.

The Court to change the Mourning, on Sunday the 27th instant, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk or velvet, coloured ribbons, fans and tippets, or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuffs, with black ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuff waistcoats, full trimmed, coloured swords and buckles.

And on Thursday the 31st instant, the Court to go out of Mourning.
