

British Guiana, County of Berbice.

Second and Last Edict.

IN pursuance of an extract from the minutes of the proceedings of the Roll Court of Civil Justice for this county, bearing date the 14th October 1840;

I, the undersigned, Marshal for the county of Berbice, in the name and behalf of Henry Welchman and Robert Samuel, as representing the estate of Robert Fraser, deceased, late of this county, do hereby, for the second and last time, by edict, cite all known and unknown creditors against the estate of said Robert Fraser, deceased, to appear at the Roll Court of Civil Justice for this county, to be holden at the Court-house, in New Amsterdam, in the month of April 1841, say at the first Roll Court in that month, in order to render their respective claims, properly attested and in due form.
