CONTRACTS FOR WINE, SUGAR, SUET, PRESERVED MEATS, AND SOUP.

Department of the Comptroller for Victualling and Transport Services, Somerset-Place, September 30, 1841.

THE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice, that on Thursday the 7th October next, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying and delivering, into Her Majesty's Victualling Stores at Deptford, the under-mentioned articles, viz.

White Wine, strong bodied, 15,000 gallons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Sugar (the produce of the British possessions), 100 tons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Suet, 220,000 lbs.; to be delivered, in equal weekly proportions, between the date of the contract and the 31st of March next.

Preserved Meats and Soup, 8000 pounds; half to be delivered in a month, and the remainder in a month afterwards.

Concentrated Gravy Soup, 1200 quarter pints; half to be delivered in a month, and the remainder in a month afterwards.

The Wine and Sugar to be exempted from the Customs' duties.

Samples of the wine (not less than two bottles), and of the sugar intended to be supplied, must be produced by the parties tendering, and a sample of the description of sugar admissible, together

with the conditions of the contracts, may be seen at the said Office.

No tender will be received after one o'clock on the day of treaty, nor any noticed unless the party attends, or an agent for him duly authorised in writing.

Every tender must be addressed to the Secretary of the Admiralty, and bear in the left hand corner the words, "Tender for" and must also be delivered at Somerset-Place, and those for sugar and suet must be accompanied by a letter, signed by two responsible persons, engaging to become bound with the person tendering, in the sum of £25 per cent. on the value, for the due performance of the contracts; and by one person for each of the other contracts.
