Buckingham-Palace, November 9, 1841.

THIS morning, at twelve minutes before eleven, the Queen was happily delivered of a Prince. His Royal Highness Prince Albert, Her Royal Highness the Duchess of Kent, several Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and the Ladies of Her Majesty's Bedchamber, being present.

This great and important news was immediately made known to the Town, by the firing of the Park and Tower Guns; and the Privy Council being as-

sembled as soon as possible thereupon, at the Council-Chamber, Whitehall, it was ordered, that a Form of Thanksgiving for the Queen's safe delivery of a Prince be prepared by his Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, to be used in all churches and chapels throughout England and Wales, and the town of Berwick-upon-Tweed, on Sunday the 14th of November, or the Sunday after the respective Ministers shall receive the same.

Her Majesty and the Infant Prince are, God be praised, both doing well.
