B

Y a Veffel which arrived here the fixth Instant from the *Levant*, we have the confinmation of the loss of two Ships of Signior Molino's Squadron which were caft away near the life of Paros, and most of the Mon drowned; but

the Cannon of one of them called the Triumphant, b ing 60 Pieces, has been fince recovered. And by another Vefiel atrited from Corfu we are informed that General Morofini having advice that a Party of between a and 300 Tarkill: Horfe were ravaging the Country near Dragomefire, he had fent thicker three Gallies and feveral Galeots with 3 or 400 Soldiers, who being landed fell upon the Enemy, and cut most of them in pieces; after which they made an Incurfion into the Territories of Zopandi and Uracori, where they burnt feveral Villages. The Senare have, it's faid, made an agreement with the Princes of Lunenburg for 8000 men ; A Courier that was lately fear to those Princes, returned hither on Monday laft, and the next day the Minister they have here had Audi-ence of the Senare. We are told that these Troops will be here in the beginning of March; and that the Republick is to pay 60000 Ducats b fore they begin their march. The Prince of Parma artived here the 7th Inftant from Dalmatia.

Genoua, Fanuary 14. They continue to work here with great diligence on the new Fortifications which the Council of War have ordered to be made; and particularly on the two Platforms on the file of the Lanterne; There is likewife building a large flat bottomed Boat with 24 Oars which is to carry 20 Pieces of Cannen; and other preparations are making, but at the fame time we are not without hopes of an accommodation. A Courier difpatched by Signior Ranazzi the Pope's Nuncio at Paris, has brought an account that his Mofi Chrifilan Majefly, at the inflance of the Pope', hath given the Republick till the end of this month, to comply with his demands, upon which the little Council did immediately affemble, but it is not yet known what refolution they have taken.

Madrid, Fannary 18. The Conde de Chinchone, who was lately made Viceroy of Navarre being very old and not enjoying his health very well, has defired leave to retire, which it's believed will be granted, and that the Grand Prior of Cafile will fucceed him in that Government. The King has given the Command of Captain-General of the Coalt of Granads to the Conde de Charni: The laft week the Conde de Alba de Lifta a Grandee of Spain, was fent Prifoner to the Caffle of Coeca about 30 leagues from hence, for refcuing a Perfor out of the hands of Jultice. On Friday laft 500

Spanish Horfe pasted within half a leigue of the plate in their march from Catalonia to Toledo, where they are to quarter.

Several Conferences have Vienna, Fanuary 21. been held here with the Envoy from the Landgrave of Heffe Caffel, upon the order made by that Prince to and the Emperor with his Troops; bit we do not hear that the number of Men or the fum of Municy that is in confideration of it to be given the Landgrave, is yet agreed. The Treasy with the Dukeso, Zell and Wosfembuttell for 5093 men, is, we are tell, concluded; And Bills of Exchange for 100 thouland Livres will in few days be delivered to the Ba on of Wa denbourg, who is here on the part of those Princes, half of which lum is to be paid at Hamburg when the laid I roops begin their march, and the other half when they are come into the Emperor's Her ditary Coung tri s. But the Conditions upon which the Duke of Hanouer is to fend his Troops to the Emperor's assistance, are not yet a justed. The States of Austria who are now allembled, have resolved The States of to give the Emperor a supply of 450 thousand Livres in Money, and one hundred thoufand tacks of Corn. The Count de Serini, G. neral of the Elector of Banaria's Forces, is arrived here from Hungary, and has, it's faid acquainted the Em-peror that the faid Troops are not able to fublift in the Quarters they are now in, General Schultz, having taken those that were aligned them; But this is not their cale alone, for we have an account from all parts of Hungary that the So diers as well as the Inhabitants fuffer very much through the fearcity there is of provisions; The Turks are in no better condition, for feveral Prifoners who have elcaped from Buda, affore us, that the want of provisions there is to great, that the Inhabitants do daily defert the Town; Ard that the Lines and other Works made by the Chriftians during the late Siege, are not yet demolished through want of Men. The Report continues that the Turks do affemble a Body of Men between Peft and Vaccia to raife the Blockade of Newbeufel, upon which orders have it's faid been fent to feveral Troops quartered thereabouts to draw together, to prevent the Enemics defign, which are to be commanded by Count Palfi. The Spanish Ambaffador has bought a great many Turks taken Pritoners fince this War, to ferve in the Spanilh Gallies.

Ratisbonne, Fanuary 18. The States of the Cirele of Franconia are to allemble the 22. Inflant an Nuremberg, to confider of the means to maintain the Troops they have refolved to fend for Hungary. The Regiment of Horfe which the Duke of Hanquer has given the Emperor, being commanded by Prince Auguilus his fecond Son, is arrivid in Bobemia, where they are to have their Winter-quarters.
