

Denbigh and Rhyddlan Trust.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session, for leave to bring in a Bill for extending the term, and altering and enlarging the powers, of an Act, passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of King George the Third, intituled "An Act for more effectually repairing the road leading from the town of Denbigh to the town of Saint Asaph, and from thence to the town and port of Ruthland, in the counties of Denbigh and Flint; and for repealing an Act, made in the thirty-second year of His late Majesty King George the Second, so far as the same relates to the said road;" also of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the thirty-ninth and fortieth years, of the reign of His said Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for continuing for twenty-one years, and from thence to the end of the then next session of Parliament, the term, and altering and enlarging the powers, of an Act, passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for more effectually repairing the road leading from the town of Denbigh to the town of Saint Asaph, and from thence to the town and port of Ruthland in the counties of Denbigh and Flint, and for repealing an Act, made in the thirty-second year of His late Majesty King George the Second, so far as the same relates to the said road;" and also of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the first and second years of the reign of King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for continuing the term, and altering and enlarging the powers, of two Acts, of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, for repairing the road from Denbigh to Saint Asaph, and from thence to Ruthland, in the counties of Denbigh and Flint;" or for repealing the said Acts, and granting further and other powers in lieu thereof.

And notice is hereby also given, that it is intended to include in the said Bill powers for making and maintaining several new turnpike roads, partly by diverting, widening, and improving certain existing highways, and partly by new cuttings, together with all necessary bridges, culverts, drains, fences, and other works, that is to say: one of such roads to commence at the top of Trefnant hill, in the township of Lleweni, in the parish of Henllan, and to terminate at or near the top of Saint Asaph street, in the city of Saint Asaph; which said intended road will pass from, to, through, or into the several parishes, townships, or extra parochial places following, that is to say, Henllan and Lleweni, in the county of Denbigh, and Saint Asaph and Brynolyn, in the county of Flint, or some of them; another of such roads to commence at or near the present terminus of the turnpike road at Rhyddlan, and to terminate at the sea beach at the end of High street, in Rhyll, and to branch off at the Mostyn Arms Inn, in Rhyll aforesaid, to the packet station at Poryd; which said intended road will pass from, in, through, or into the several parishes, townships, or extra parochial places following, that is to say, Rhyddlan and Saint Asaph parishes, and Scawen, Criccin, Brynbychan, Brynwal, Cefndu, Tre-Llewellyn, and Rhyll townships, or some of them, all in the county of Flint;

another of such roads to commence at or near the before mentioned present terminus of the turnpike road, at Rhyddlan, and to terminate by a junction with the Mostyn trust, at its terminus, at or near Talacre; which said intended road will pass from, in, through, or into the several parishes, townships, or extra parochial places following, that is to say, Rhyddlan, Dyserth, Meliden, Llanasa, and Saint Asaph parishes, and Scawen, Criccin, Brynbychan, Pentre, Trellan, Tre Llewellyd, Tre Castle, Tre Rhyd, Meliden, Prestatyn, Nant and Gronant townships, or some of them, all in the said county of Flint; another of such roads to commence at or near the before mentioned present terminus of the turnpike road at Rhyddlan, and to terminate by a junction with the Mostyn trust, at its terminus, at Newmarket; which said intended road will pass from, in, through, or into the several parishes, townships, or extra parochial places following, that is to say, Saint Asaph, Rhyddlan, Dyserth, Newmarket, and Llanasa parishes, and Scawen, Criccin, Brynbychan, Trellan, Tre Castle, Gop Graig, and Axton townships, or some of them, all in the said county of Flint; another of such roads to commence at or near Trefnant in the before mentioned parish of Henllan, and to terminate by a junction with the Denbigh and Mold turnpike road, at or near a place called the Blue Head, in the parish of Henllan, in the said county of Denbigh; which said intended road will pass from, in, through, or into the several parishes, townships, or extra parochial places following, that is to say, Henllan parish, and Banister-ucha, Banister-issa, and Lleweni townships, or some of them, all in the said county of Denbigh; another of such roads to commence at or near Rhyddlan Bridge, and to terminate by a junction with the Saint Asaph trust, at the entrance into the town of Abergele, in the parish of Abergele; which said intended road will pass from, in, through, or into the several parishes, townships, or extra parochial places following, that is to say, Saint Asaph parish, and Pengwern, Bodlewyddan and Faenol townships, or some of them, in the said county of Flint, and Saint George, and Abergele parishes, and Trellan, Bodoryn, Bodtegwyl, Hendregyddau, and Abergele townships, or some of them, in the said county of Denbigh; another of such roads to commence at a certain house, in the occupation of Miss Charlotte Douglas, in the said parish of Saint Asaph, and to terminate by a junction with the Saint Asaph trust, at the entrance into the said town of Abergele; which said intended road will pass from, in, through, or into the several parishes, townships, or extra parochial places following, that is to say, Saint Asaph parish, and Falar, Pengwern, Bodlewyddan, and Faenol townships, or some of them, in the said county of Flint, and Saint George and Abergele parishes, and Bodoryn, Trellan, Saint George, and Bodtegwyl townships, or some of them, in the said county of Denbigh.

And notice is hereby further given, that by the said Bill it is intended to alter the existing tolls authorised by the aforesaid Acts, or some of them, to be collected upon, or in respect of, the roads therein comprised, and to vary or extinguish the exemptions from payment of toll, and other rights and privileges therein contained, and to confer other ex-
