that the preparations for the War are made with great diligence and good fucces; That the Commifions and Moneys for the new Recruits have been given out to the Officers that are to be employed therein; And that the Imperial Commiffaries have bought up great quantities of Corn, which fo foon as the River is open will be carried for Hungary to fill the Magazines at Raab, Comorra and other places in Hungary.

Francfort, February 4. The last Letters from Fienna gave an account, That the Armenian sent by the Visier of Buda had had Audience of the Marquis de Baden, President of the Council of War, and had declared to him, That if the Emperor was inclined to a Poace he had Orders to make some Overtures towards it, but that it was not known what Answer had been given him. And that the Imperial Court was upon removing to Lintz, where the Mariage between the Elector of Bavaria and the Arch-Dutches will be celebrated at the Carnaval. In the mean time that Elector does make great preparations for the next Campagne, intending to allist the Emperor with 20000 men, which he will command in Person as he did the last Summer.

Cologne, lebruary 6. The Coupt de Daun and the Baron de Meyetsheim are come back hither from Bon ; And the Baron Gortz Envoy Extraordinary from the States of Franconia is returned home, having before his departure from hence had feveral Conferences with them; The Troops of the Circle of Franconia will begin their march for Hungary about the middle of the next month; And those which our Elector fends to the Emperor's Affiftance will march about the fame time; And with thefe and the Succorsfrom the Dukes of Lunenburg, the Landgrave of Heffe and other Princes of the Empire, the Emperor will have a great Army the next Summer, which it's hoped will be in the Field much fooner than the Enemy. The States of Bergs and Faliers are to meet at Dufeldorp as this day; Their Duke is raising Men to affilt the Emperor, and has -called the States together to demand a supply of Money of them. The Clergy of Liege have, it's staid, agreed to the Sublidies demanded by the Elector of Cologne their Prince.

Bruffels, February 6. The Marquis de Grana having received an account from Wert near Ruresmond, that a Regiment of Dragoons belonging to the Elector of Gologne had taken their Winterquarters in that place, he was much surprized at tity and let his Electoral Highness's Minister here know, That he would fond a Body of Horfe and Dragoons to oblige them to diflodge, upon which an Express was dispatched to Liege to inform the Billiop of Strasburg. of his Excellency's refolution, who returned this Answer, That the faid Regiment of Dragoons did not belong to the Elector of Colegne but to therEmperor, in whole Service they now actually are, and that Monficur Meyersheim the Imperial Commillary had affigned them those Quarters, and that the left it to him to justify what he had done ; which has for the prefent fomewhat intisfied his Excellency. The Letters from Bologne of the nath of the laft month tell us, that the Pope was very much troubled with a defluxion

Viena to pay his Refects to his Excellency, and to give him an account of the State of his Regiment; He clis us that the Preparations for the uext Campagne go on very fuccesfully; And that the Emperor will have a great Army in the Field, very early in the Summer. They write irom Cologne that the Magifirates of that City have complained to the Elector of Cologne, that the Libabitants cannot flir out of the Lown without danger of being made Prifoners by his Electoral Highnes's Troops, who take all thefe they meet with; but that they have not received the fatiffaction they expected.

Hague, February 9. The States of Holland and Welt-Frizeland re-affembled yelterday. The Deputies of the Town of Dort complained of the Proceedings of the Commillioners of the Court of Juffice in obliging the Deacons of the leveral Trades of that City to make a new Nomination of Perfons to be prefented to the Prince of Orange, notwithflanding the Magifrates to maintain their antient Rights had forbid the faid Deacons to meet, and had folemaly protefted that they would look upon fuch a Nomination as irregular and void. The City of Ams, rdam and fome other Towns do very much preis to have a farther Reform made in the Troops of the State. The Deputies of the Admiraltics, who are now here, have had feveral Conferences with those of the States concerning the present condition of the Fleet and the Building of fome new Ships. The Heer Spacen Lieutenant-General of the Elector of Brandenburg's Forces is find here, but will part from hence in two or three days to return to Cleves.

Paris, February 10. The 8th Inflant the Sieur Ranuzzi the Pope's Nuncio had a private Audience of the King, and acquainted him by order of his Holinefs that the Republick of Geneng. had at last refolved to give his Majefly all the Satisfaction He has demanded of them. The Duke of Orleans is very much indipoled, having had feveral firs of an intermitting Fever; the first tools him the 8th Inflant as he was going abread. The Marquis de Fenquieres, whom the King has manned to go his Ambaflador to the Court of Spain, will, we are told, begin his journey thicher in ten days orfa fortnight.
