N Monday last in the morning our late Gracious Soveraiga King Charles the Second was seized with a violent Fit, by which his Speech and Senfes were for some time taken from him, but upon the immediate application of fitting Remedies He returned to fuch a condition as gave fome hopes of His Recovery till Wednefday night, at which time the Disease returning upon him with greater violence, He expired this day about Noon. which the Privy Council affembling His present Majesty made a most Gracious Declaration to them, and caused all the Lords and others of his late Majesty's Privy-Council that were then present to be Sworn of His Privy-Council, And ordered a Proclamation to be published, signifying His Majesty's Pleasure, That all Men being in Oslice of Government at the Decease of the late King, shall so continue till His Majelty's farther direction. And in the Afternoon the King was Proclaimed before Whitehall-Gate, at Temple-Bar, and the Royal-Exchange, with the usual Solemnity.

Hereas it buth pleased Almights God to call to his mercy our late Soveraign Lord King Charles the Second of Bleffed Memory, by whose Decease, the Imperial Crowns of England, Scotland, Franco and Ireland, are solely and rightfully come to the High and Mighty Prince James, Duke of York and Albany.
