

enjoyed the same, until His Majesty's Pleasure be further known.

And that in the mean while, for the Preservation of the Peace, and necessary Proceedings in matters of Justice, and for the Safety and Service of the State; All the said Persons of whatsoever Degree or Condition may not fail, every one severally, according to his Place, Office, or Charge, to proceed in the Performance and Execution of all Duties thereunto belonging, as formerly appertained unto them, and every of them, while the late Kings Majesty was living.

And further, His Majesty doth hereby Will and Command all and singular His Highness Subjects, of what Estate, Dignity, or Degree, they or any of them be, to be Aiding, Helping and Assisting, and at the Commandment of the said Officers and Ministers, in the Performance and Execution of the said Offices and Places, as they and every of them Tender His Majesty's Displeasure, and will answer for the Contrary at their uttermost Perils.

And further His Majesty's Will and Pleasure and Express Commandment is, That all Orders and Directions Made or Given by the Lords of the Privy Council of the Late King, in His Life-time, shall be Obedyed and Performed by all and every Person and Persons, and all and every Thing and Things to be done thereupon, shall Proceed as Fully and as Amply as the same should have been Obedyed or Done, in the Life of the said Late King; His Majesty's most Dearly and Entirely Beloved Brother.

Given at the Court at Whitehall the Sixth day of February, in the First Year of His Majesty's Reign of England, Scotland, France and Ireland.

God Save the King.

His Majesty at His first sitting in His Privy-Council, was Graciously pleased to Express Himself in this manner :

My Lords,

BEfore I enter upon any other Business, I think fit to say something to you. Since it hath pleased Almighty God to place Me in this Station, and I am now to succeed so Good and Gracious a King, as well as so very kind a Brother, I think it fit to Declare to you, That I will Endeavour to follow His Example, and most especially in that of his great Clemency and Tenderness to His People: I have been reported to be a Man for Arbitrary Power, but that is not the onely Story his been made of Me; And I shall make it My Endeavour to Preserve this Government both in Church and State as it is now by Law Established. I know the Principles of the Church of England are for Monarchy, and the Members of it have shewed themselves Good and Loyal Subjects, therefore I shall always take care to Defend and Support It. I know too that the Laws of England are sufficient to make the King as Great a Monarch as I can Wish; and as I shall never depart from the Just Rights and Prerogative of the Crown, so I shall never Invade any Mans Property. I have often

heretofore, ventured My Life in Defence of this Nation; And I shall still go as far as any Man in Preserving it in all its Just Rights and Liberties.

Whereupon the Lords of the Council were humble Suitors to His Majesty, that these His Gracious Expressions might be made publick; Which His Majesty did order accordingly.

Vienna, January 24. Count Palfi, who parted from hence on Monday last, is to command the Hungarian Troops, and has orders to join Colonel Heusler to block up *Newweusel*. The Turks have of late appeared in very considerable Bodies near *Vicegrad*, which makes us believe they have a design upon that place; but we hope it is in no danger: being provided with a good Garrison; and all things necessary for its defence. The Count de *Sapona* arrived here this week from *Hungary*, to give the Emperor an account of the condition the Troops quartered about *Zatmar* (of which place he is Governor) are in, and to sollicite Money for the payment of them.

Cologne, February 7. The Count de *Dann* and the Baron de *Meyersheim*, the Imperial Ministers are still here. They have called upon the Magistrates of this City to hasten the assistance they are to send to the Emperor. We have an account that the Landgrave of *Hesse Cassel* has promised to assist his Imperial Majesty with 5000 men.

Brussels, February 13. The Reform will now be finished in few days, of which we may be able to give you a particular account in our next. Some of the reformed Colonels are already parted from hence for *Spain*; And others are preparing to follow. We have an account from *Liege* that the States of that Country have given their Prince the Subsidies he demanded for the War against the Turks.
