and Aldermen in their Scarlet Gowns, assisted by the Preben-
daries, the Warden, and Fellows of the Colledge, and the
most considerable of the Inhabitants of this place: The Train-
Bands were in Arms, and gave several Volleys of Small Shot;
and in the Evening the Streets were filled with Bonfires, accom-
panied with ringing of Bells, and loud Acclamations of Joy.

Bristol, Febr. 8. This Day the Mayor, with the Aldermen and
Deputy-Lieutenants. Proclaimed His Majesty King JAMES the
Second; which was done with great Solemnity, and with all the
Expressions of a general Joy.

Reading, Febr. 9. This Day His Majesty was Proclaimed here
by the Mayor and his Brethren in their Formalities, accom-
panied with the Clergy and Gentry in and about this Borough;
the People expressing their Joy with repeated Acclamations.

Lincoln, Febr. 9. This Day His Majesty was Proclaimed here
by the Magistrates in their Scarlet Gowns, accompanied with
the Gentry and Clergy of this City, all on Horseback, which
was performed with all Solemnity, great Joy and Acclamations.
