The 12th Inflant the Articles concerning the Submillion of the Republick of Ganoua were Signed at Verfailles, by which it is agreed, That the Dogeand four Senators of Genous shall repair to Musfeilles, or some other place of this Kiag-dom, before the soth of April at farthest, from where the King is; and being admitted to Audience in their Robes of Ceremony, the Doge shall in the Name of the Republick declare their great Regret for having displeased his Majesty, and shall use such other submissive and respectful Expressions as may best manifest the sincere of fine the Republick has to

descrive for the future his Majesties kindness. That the faid Doge and Senators shall at their return to Genous re-enter upon the exercise of their respective Places and Functions. That the Republick shall difmiss within a month the Spanish Troops which they have received into any of their places; And do by the present Treaty renounce all Leagues and Associations made fince the first of Fanuary 1683. That the Republick shall reduce their Gallies to the same number they were three years agone; and shall disarm those they have fitted out fince. That the Republick thall reftore what can be found remaining of the Es fects taken from the French; and his Majesty in lieu of other Reparations for the Loffes fuffained by his Subjects, is content the Genoueles thall give such a sum of Money, as the Pope shall think fit, towards the repairing the Churches and Convents at Genous that were ruined or damnified by the Bombs the laft year. That the Republick shall pay within two Months 100 thousand Crowns to the Count de Fiesque, but without prejudicing the Reaft us they have against the faid Count; and his Majelly promites that he will not support with his Arms, or other Force the Pretentions of the fiid Count, but will leave them to be decided by the Methods of Justice. The King will give the faid Doge and Senators fuch a favourable Reception as may la issie them of the return of his Royal Kindness: And after having performed the function they are sent for, they may return to Goneua, his Majesty declaring that no other Conditions or Demands thall be imposed upon them but such as are agreed by this Treaty. All acts of Hoffelity to cease within a month, and all Prisoners to be set me liberty.
