

CONTRACTS FOR WHEAT, RUM, SUGAR, COCOA, SOAP, PEAS, TOBACCO, WINE, OATS, LEMON JUICE CASES AND BOTTLES.

Department of the Comptroller for Victualling and Transport Services, Somerset-Place, June 16, 1842.

THE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admirals of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice, that on Thursday, the 23d June instant, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying and delivering into Her Majesty's Victualling Stores at Deptford the under-mentioned articles, viz.

Wheat, Red, 2000 quarters; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Wheat White, 700 quarters; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Rum (the produce of the British possessions, and not less than half to be the produce of the British possessions in the West Indies), 100,000 gallons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Sugar (the produce of the British possessions), 100 tons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Cocoa, 100 tons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Soap, Mottled, 30 tons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Peas, 500 quarters; half to be delivered in a fortnight, and the remainder in a fortnight afterwards.

Tobacco, 20 tons; half to be delivered in a fortnight, and the remainder in a fortnight afterwards.

Wine, Port, 1000 gallons; to be delivered within a fortnight.

Oats, Scotch Potatoe, 500 quarters; half to be delivered in a week, and the remainder in a week afterwards.

Lemon Juice Cases, large, 300 number; to be delivered within two months.

Lemon Juice Cases, small, 300 number; to be delivered within two months.

Lemon Juice Bottles, 12,000 number; to be delivered within two months.

The Rum, Sugar, Cocoa, Tobacco, and Wine to be exempted from the Customs' duties.

Samples of the wheat, peas, and oats (not less than two quarts of each), of the cocoa (not less than two pounds), of the wine (not less than two bottles), and of the sugar intended to be supplied, must be produced by the parties tendering, and samples

of the soap, tobacco, lemon juice bottles, and of the description of sugar admissible, may be seen at the said Office, and patterns of the lemon juice cases may be seen on application to the Captain Superintendent at Deptford.

The conditions of the contracts may be seen at the said Office.

No tender will be received after one o'clock on the day of treaty, nor any noticed unless the party attends, or an agent for him duly authorised in writing.

Every tender must be addressed to the Secretary of the Admiralty, and bear in the left hand corner the words, "Tender for" and must also be delivered at Somerset-place, and those for rum, sugar, and cocoa must be accompanied by a letter, signed by two responsible persons, and those for wine, lemon juice cases and bottles by one responsible person, engaging to become bound with the person tendering, in the sum of £25 per cent. on the value, for the due performance of the contracts.
