NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session, for leave to bring in a Bill, and to obtain an Act for establishing and incorporating a company for the purpose of better supplying with water, and more efficiently protecting from fire, the inhabitants of the town of Brixthelmston, and also such parts of the adjoining parish of Hove, and such other parishes as are adjacent or near to the aforesaid town, and for making and maintaining, erecting, placing, constructing, and completing reservoirs, mains, pipes, shafts, drains, sluices, channels, and other necessary works and conveniences for the purposes aforesaid, within the several parishes, townships, hamlets, or places of Poynings, Newtimber, Saddlescombe, Fulking, Edburton, Henfield, Beeding, Shoreham, Kingston, Southwick, Portslade, Hangleton, West Blatchington, Aldrington, Patcham, Preston, Hove, and Brixthelmston, all in the county of Sussex; and it is intended by the said Act to obtain powers, for the purposes aforesaid, to take and use the waters of certain springs and streams, called the Poynings spring and Fulking spring, and situate in the parishes of Newtimber, Poynings, and Edburton; and it is also intended to take power by the said Act to purchase and take certain land and property, and to construct steam or other engines, with all other necessary and sufficient powers and provisions for carrying the said intended Act into full and complete execution; and it is further intended to empower the said company to levy certain rates, and to charge and take rents or sums of money for the supplying with water the town and parishes adjoining.
