CONTRACTS FOR WHEAT, PEAS, TOBACCO, RICE, WILLOW RODS, AND COOPER'S FLAGS.

Department of the Comptroller for Victualling and Transport Services, Somerset-Place, November 22, 1842.

THE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice,

that, on Thursday the 1st of December next, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying and delivering into Her Majesty's Victualling Stores at Deptford, the under-mentioned articles, viz.

Wheat, Red, 2000 quarters; half to be delivered in a fortnight, and the remainder in a fortnight afterwards.

Wheat, White, 600 quarters; half to be delivered in a fortnight, and the remainder in a fortnight afterwards.

Peas, 500 quarters; half to be delivered in a fortnight, and the remainder in a fortnight afterwards.

Tobacco, 20 tons; half to be delivered in a fortnight, and the remainder in a fortnight afterwards.

Rice, East India, 10 tons; to be delivered within ten days.

Willow Rods, 1000 mille; to be delivered by the 31st January next, in equal weekly proportions.

Cooper's Flags, 500 bolts; to be delivered by the 31st January next, in equal weekly proportions.

The Tobacco and Rice to be exempted from the Customs' duties.

Samples of the wheat and peas (not less than two quarts of each), of the rice (not less than two pounds), and of the rods (not less than 500 great tale), must be produced by the parties tendering, and a sample of the tobacco, together with the conditions of the contracts, may be seen at the said Office.

No tender will be received after one o'clock on the day of treaty, nor any noticed unless the party attends; or an agent for him duly authorized in writing.

Every tender must be addressed to the Secretary of the Admiralty, and bear in the left hand corner the words, "Tender for . . .," and must also be delivered at Somerset-place.
