THÉREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the thirteenth day of this instant December; We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said thirteenth day of December instant, to Thursday the second day of February next; and We have given order to our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly; and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Thursday the second day of February next, assemble and be holden for the dispatch of divesr urgent and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Thursday the second day of February next.

Given at our Court at Windsor, this tenth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, and in the sixth year of Our reign.

The Lord Chancellor has appointed Charles Butlin, of Snenton Hermitage, in the county of Nottingham, Gent. to be a Master Extraordinary in the High Court of Chancery.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament, made and passed in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of His Majesty King William the Third, intituled "An Act for the increase and preservation of timber in New Forest, in the county of Southampton," it was required, that one thousand acres, part of the waste lands of the said forest, should be enclosed and kept in severalty, for the growth and preservation of timber for the supply of His Majesty's Royal Navy, forthwith after the passing of the said Act; and that in the year following one thousand acres more, part of the said waste lands, should be in like manner enclosed; and that two hundred acres more, part also of the said waste lands, should yearly, and in every year, for the term or space of twenty years from and after the time that the several inclosures of the two thousand acres above mentioned should be made and completed, be in like manner enclosed, and kept in severalty as aforesaid, in the actual possession of the Crown; freed and discharged of and from all manner of rights, title, and pretence whatever, and should be called, made, and kept as a nursery for wood and timber only:

And whereas it was also directed by the said Act, that whenever the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lord High Treasurer of England, or Chancellor of the Exchequer, for the time being, should be satisfied and should determine that the woods and trees which should be growing on any of the inclosures made under and by virtue of the said Act, or any part thereof, are become past danger of browsing of deer, cattle, or other prejudice, and shall think fit to lay the same, or any part thereof, open and in common, then and so often it may be lawful for His Majesty, his heirs and successors, from time to time, to inclose. in lieu of so much of the said inclosures as shall be so laid open, the like quantity of the waste of the said forest, to be holden freed and dis-charged of and from all manner of common or other rights for so long time as the same shall remain and continue to be inclosed; and whereas by another Act, of the forty-eighth George the Third, cap. 72, the powers of the before-mentioned Act were revived and confirmed, and inclosures and plantations were made to the full extent of six thousand acres, authorized by the Acts:

And whereas the quantity of three hundred and ninety four acres, three roods, and thirty-six perches, part of the waste lands of the said forest, was inclosed, pursuant to the provisions of the said last-mentioned Act, and it has been certified to the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, on the authority of Lieutenant-Colonel Thornhill, Deputy Surveyor of New Forest, Thomas White, D. Whitbourne, John Brown, and Frederick Fuller, Regarders of the Forest, that the woods and trees growing on the said three hundred and ninety-four acres, three roods, and thirty-six perches, are become past danger of browsing of cattle, deer, or other prejudice, viz.

We, being three of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, think fit to lay the same open and in common, and do hereby declare and make known, that the inclosures above mentioned are laid open and in common accordingly, to the intent that an equal quantity of other waste lands of the same forest may be inclosed in lieu thereof, and kept in severalty for the growth and preservation of timber, agreeably to the directions of the said Acts.

> At the Court at Windsor, the 24th of September 1842, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fiftyeighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divi-sions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church | year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council,

in the words following, viz.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the firstto prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of Lanchester, in the county and diocese of Durham, contained a population of seven thousand eight hundred and

seventy-four persons:

"That, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to six hundred persons, there are five consecrated chapels in the said parish, namely, at Satley, Esk, Medomsley, Ebchester, and Collierley; that the said lastmentioned chapel, at Collierley, is called Saint Thomas's, and affords accommodation to three hundred persons, including two hundred and fifty free seats appropriated to the use of the poor:

"That such chapel has been consecrated."

"That such chapel has been consecrated, and divine service is regularly performed therein:

" Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient that an ecclesiastical district should, under the provisions of the twenty-first section of the said Statute, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, be divided from the said parish of Lanchester, and assigned to the said chapel of St. Thomas, at Collierly, for the purpose of affording accommodation for attending divine service to the persons residing in the said district, and for enabling the spiritual person serving the said chapel to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the district attached to the said chapel, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the moral habits of the persons residing therein; and that such district should be named, " The District Parish of Collierley:"

"The district is to consist of the townships of Collierley, Kyo, and Billingside, and part of the township of Greencroft, the same being bounded on or towards the north, north east, and east, by the chapelry of Tanfield, in the parish of Chesterle-Street; on the south east by the road leading from Shield-row to the turnpike gate on the Newcistle and Wolsingham turnpike road (including all the houses on the north west side thereof); it then proceeds south along the turnpike road towards Lanchester (including all the houses on the west side thereof) till it meets the road leading to Greencroft tower, and proceeds down that road, in a south westerly direction, as far as the gate leading to the tower; thence westerly along the rold leading to Shotley Bridge, as far as the road leading from Collierley to Ireston; whence it proceeds north along the centre of that road, as far as another road leading to Shotley Bridge (between the townships of Collierley, Billingside, and Ireston), as far as the chapelry of Medomsley; it then proceeds in a northern direction along the boundary that divides the said chapelry from the townships of Billingside and Collierley, until they meet the chapelry of Tanfield, at the north western point of the district, as is more particularly shewn by the map hereunto annexed, and thereon tinted red:

"That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Durham has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed division and assignment be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but sub-

ject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding:

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled 'An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes; also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish or parochial chapelry of St. John, within the vicarage of the original parish of St. Nicholas, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, in the counties of Northumberland and Newcastle-upon-Tyne and diocese of Durham, contained a population of twenty-two thousand four hundred and fifty-two persons:

" That, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to one thousand six hundred persons, there are two consecrated chapels, namely, St. Paul's, in the town, and St. James, at Benwell, the latter of which affords accommodation to six hundred and thirty-three persons, including four hundred free seats appropriated to the use of

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the said chapel, at Benwell, called St. James, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry of St. James, Benwell," with boundaries as follow:

"The proposed district of Saint James comprehends the whole of the township of Benwell, and part of the township of Elswick, and is bounded on the south by the river Tyne; on the west by the township of East Denton, in the parish of Newburn; on the north west by the township of Fenham, in the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Andrew; and on the north east by a portion of the tract of uninclosed ground, called Newcastle Town Moor, also in the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Andrew; and on the east the boundary is situate within the township of Elswick, and commencing at the said Town Moor, at the north end of an ancient hedge or fence, separating the lands and premises of the late Mr. David Laidlow from land belonging to the heirs of the late Mr. George Brown, passes southward, along the same hedge or fence, to the Newcastle and Carlisle turnpike road, where it turns eastward, for the distance of forty-eight yards along the said turnpike road, to the north end of an ancient lane, called the Mill Lane, when it again takes a south-

> "That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Durham has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

> "Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the beforementioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

> Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and that the recommendation of the said Commissioners in respect of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees thereon be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
