Dona's Gallies mifesking the Port of Sauona in the night, unfortunately ran afhore neer Arbigola, and was loft. fame day Intelligence was brought u, that two Ships belonging to this place, and bound for Lisbon, was filed by the French, under the pretente of carrying Goods for Alicant, and men put aboard them to bring them off for Thoulon , and whereupon four of our Gillies were immediately fent out to have retaken her, but were prevented by a B igantine of Ma. jorca, which having taken in men at Finale, affeulted the Veffelin the night, and after two hours fight with the French, feiled and carried her off.

The action of the French has put a flop to the going out f s Ship of this place of 44 Guns, and 150 men, intended for Lisbon, but now flayes to go in company wi hother Merchants and two Men of Warre of 50 or 60 Guas apiec , bich may

be really to put to fea by the end of this Month.

Hull, Oft. 21. The 19 hi ftant arrived two V. ffels from Rotterdam.
