Thomas Earl of Wilton, and of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon, and the Reverend Andrew Cassels, Vicar of Batley aforesaid, testified in like manner, that the patronage and right of nomination and presentation of and to the said perpetual curacy of Gildersome shall become and be transferred to, and absolutely vested in, the said Andrew Cassels, and his successors, vicars of Batley, for ever:

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure respecting the matters to which this scheme relates, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the several dioceses of Gloucester and Bristol, Salisbury, and Ripon.
