THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to enable Her Majesty to indemnify the holders of certain forged Exchequer Bills.

An Act to discontinue certain actions, under the provisions of an Act of the second year of King William the Fourth, for regulating the vend and delivery of coals in the cities of London and Westminster, and in certain parts of the adjacent counties.

THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning chapelry districts to the chapels of St. David, at Holmebridge; Christ Church, at Linthwaite; Trinity Church, at South Crosland; Emmanuel Church, at Lockwood; and All Saints, at Netherthong, in the parish of Almondbury, in the county of York, under the 16th section of the 59th Geo 3., cap. 134:

At the Court at Windsor, the 10th of December 1842, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all

ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;” and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, “that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:”

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of

Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes:” it is, amongst other things, enacted, “that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapel shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding.”

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled ‘An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;’” and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled “An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled ‘An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for build-

ing, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect:

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the sixth day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of Almondbury, in the county of York and diocese of Ripon, contained a population of thirty-seven thousand three hundred and nine persons:

"That, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to nine hundred and fifty persons, there are nine consecrated chapels in the said parish, including the chapel of St. David, at Holmebridge, which affords accommodation to seven hundred and seventy-four persons, including six hundred and seventy-four free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; the chapel of Christ Church, at Linthwaite, which affords accommodation to eight hundred persons, including two hundred free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; the chapel of the Holy Trinity, at South Crosland, which affords accommodation to seven hundred persons, including three hundred and twenty-two free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; the chapel of Emmanuel, at Lockwood, which affords accommodation to nine hundred and twenty persons, including three hundred and ninety-eight free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; and the chapel of All Saints, at Netherthong, which affords accommodation to seven hundred persons, including three hundred and eighteen free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; and that divine service is regularly performed in the said chapels:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to each of the said chapels at Holmebridge, Linthwaite, South Crosland, Lockwood, and Netherthong, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of

Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such districts should be respectively named, "The Chapelry District of Saint David, Holmebridge;" "The Chapelry District of Christ Church, Linthwaite;" "The Chapelry District of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland;" "The Chapelry District of Emmanuel, Lockwood;" and "The Chapelry District of All Saints, Netherthong;" with boundaries as follow:

"The chapelry district of Saint David, Holmebridge, is to consist of the two townships of Austonley and Holme, the same being bounded on the east by the parish of Kirkburton; on the south east by the parish of Penistone; on the south by the county palatine of Chester; on the west and north by the township of Upperrthong, in the parish of Almondbury; the said district is further to consist of Wessenden-head Allotment, awarded to the township of Austonley, which allotment is bounded on the east and south by the township of Upperrthong; on the west by the parish of Saddleworth; and on the north by the township of Marsden, in Almondbury parish, which district is more particularly described on the plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon tinted brown:

"The chapelry district of Christ Church, Linthwaite, is to consist of the chief part of the township of Linthwaite, and a small portion of the township of South Crosland, the same being bounded on the north by the parish of Huddersfield; on the west by the township of Lingards; on the south by the townships of Meltham and South Crosland; and on the east by a lane dividing the townships of South Crosland and Lockwood; thence running westerly on the Old Turnpike-road to the junction of the road leading to Linthwaite Chapel; thence northerly, up the centre of the said road, to the north west corner of Pym Royd-wood; thence proceeding north easterly, on the north side of the said wood, to a wall fence dividing the property of John Eastwood; running northerly to the river Colne, which divides the parish of Almondbury from the parish of Huddersfield, as shewn on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon tinted blue:

"The chapelry district of the Holy Trinity, South Crosland, is to consist of the chief part of the township of South Crosland, with a part of the township of Honley, and is bounded on the north and north east by the townships of Linthwaite and Lockwood; on the west by the township of Meltham; on the south, in part by the road of Honley Wood-bottom, commencing on the south west corner, at a certain property called the Farm, belonging to the Earl of Dartmouth, and terminating at Lord's-mill, and in other part by the township of Honley; and on the east by the township of Almondbury, running northwards to a fence dividing the properties of Lord Dartmouth and William Brooke, Esq.; thence by the property of William Brooke, Esq., consisting of wood land and buildings, and usually called Armitage-bridge, by other properties designated the Armitage, and by the Lockwood and Meltham turnpike road, as shewn on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon tinted yellow:

" The chapelry district of Emmanuel Church, Lockwood, is to consist of the chief part of the township of Lockwood, and part of the township of Almondbury, and is bounded on the east and north east by the boundary of the township of Lockwood, from the point of the junction of the river Holme with the river Colne, to the point where the river Colne is crossed by the Old Manchester-road; thence on the north and north west, it is bounded by the Old Manchester-road as far as the north end of a lane which divides the township of Lockwood from the township of Linthwaite, and which runs in a southerly direction to the boundary of the township of South Crosland; here, turning to the south east, the district boundary is the boundary of the township of Lockwood, to the point in Dungeon-bottom, where the township boundary line meets the river Holme; at this point the district boundary line crosses the river Holme, and enters the township of Almondbury, proceeding in a south easterly direction, in a straight line, across the Huddersfield and Woodshead-road, to the north angle of a wood called Hall Bowerwood, the property of Mr. John Taylor; thence, in a straight line, north east by east, to Daisy Royd; from Daisy Royd, the boundary line follows the road which passes Jack Royd, to Bum Royd; from Bum Royd, it follows the occupation road leading to New Laith-hill; thence it runs in a north easterly direction to Tunnicliff-hill; and then following the Steel Common-road, to the point of its junction with the Old Coal Wagon-road, it passes along the Old Coal Wagon-road to the point where the said Old Coal Wagon-road meets the river Colne; whence the river Colne is the boundary of the district to the junction of the rivers Colne and Holme, as shewn on the map heretunto annexed, and thereon tinted green:

" The chapelry district of All Saints, Netherthong, comprizes the whole of the township of Netherthong, and part of the township of Honley; it is bounded on the east by the parish of Kirkburton; on the south by the township of Upperthong; on the west by the township of Meltham, as far as the north western extremity of the township of Netherthong; and from the north western extremity of such township, the boundary is formed by a straight line drawn in a north easterly direction to meet (at the nearest point) the Meltham-road; it then proceeds along the centre of that road, in an easterly direction, as far as Wood Nook-lane; the boundary then proceeds in a south easterly direction along the centre of that lane, as far as the road called Spinner-gate, which it intersects at right angles; from this point of intersection, it proceeds up the centre of Spinner-gate, in a north easterly direction, as far as Oldfield Cross-road; and then by the said Oldfield Cross-road, in a south easterly direction, as far as the Oldfield-road; from whence it proceeds in an easterly direction, along the centre of the last-mentioned road, and the lane called Smithy Place-lane, until the last-mentioned lane enters the Hole Firth turnpike-road; when it proceeds in a northerly direction along that road, as far as Banks-mill; from which mill it proceeds by the river Holme, in an easterly and southerly

direction, as far as Smithy Place-bridge; it then crosses that bridge, and continues along a public footpath called Riding's Foot-path, which runs in a north easterly direction on the side of Cliff-wood, and enters the occupation road which leads in a north easterly direction through the field called Newlay's, and terminates in the public road from Thurstonland to Honley; from this point the boundary is the same as the boundary which divides the township of Honley from the township of Farnley Tyas on the north, and from the parish of Kirkburton on the east, as shewn by the map heretunto annexed, and thereon tinted pink:

" That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said five chapels; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the respective Ministers thereof:

" That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Ripon has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

" Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignments be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, with respect of the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
