The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade to China and India," it was, amongst other things, enacted, that it should and might be lawful for His Majesty, by any such Order or Orders, Commission, or Commissions, as to His Majesty in Council should appear expedient and salutary, to give to the Superintendents in the said Act mentioned, or any of them, powers and authorities over and in respect of the trade and commerce of His Majesty's subjects within any part of the dominions of the Emperor of China, and to make and issue directions and regulations touching the said trade and commerce, and for the government of His Majesty's subjects within the said dominions, and to impose penalties, forfeitures, or imprisonments for the breach of any such directions or regulations, to be enforced in such manner as in the said Order or Orders should be specified:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to prohibit, and doth hereby prohibit, Her subjects from resorting, for the purposes of trade and commerce, to any other ports in the dominions of the Emperor of China than those of Canton, Amoy, Foo-chow-foo, Ningpo, and Shanghai, or than may be in the occupation of Her Majesty's forces; and Her Majesty is pleased to order, that any of Her subjects, committing a breach or violation of this direction, shall, upon

conviction thereof in any of Her Majesty's Courts of Record or Vice-Admiralty, be, for every such offence, liable to a penalty, not exceeding one hundred pounds, or to imprisonment, for a term not exceeding three months, at the discretion of the Court before which the conviction shall take place; and Her Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that all proceedings, which may be had under this Order, shall be, as far as circumstances will permit, in conformity with the Law of England:

And the Right Honourable the Earl of Aberdeen, and the Right Honourable Lord Stanley, two of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury; and the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral; are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

**T**HE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning chapelry districts to the chapels of St. James, in the town of Halifax; St. Martin, in Brighthouse; St. John, in Ovenden; St. George, in Sowerby; and St. Andrew, in Stainland, all in the parish of Halifax, in the county of York, under the 16th section of the 59th Geo 3., cap. 134:

At the Court at Windsor, the 10th of December 1842, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution,

the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;” and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, “that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:”

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fifty-

ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes:” it is, amongst other things, enacted, “that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding:”

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled ‘An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;’” and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled “An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late

Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;' further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect:

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the fourteenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches;" beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of Halifax, in the county of York and diocese of Ripon, contained a population of one hundred and thirty-three thousand persons:

"That, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to one thousand nine hundred persons, there are twenty consecrated churches and chapels in the said parish, including the five following, namely, the chapel of St. James, in the town of Halifax, built by your Majesty's said Commissioners, which affords accommodation to one thousand two hundred and six persons, including four hundred and twenty-seven free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; the chapel of St. Martin, in Brighouse, also built by your Majesty's said Commissioners, which affords accommodation to one thousand one hundred and thirty persons, including five hundred and fifty-eight free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; the chapel of St. John, in Ovenden, also built partly by a grant in aid from your Majesty's said Commissioners, which affords accommodation to three hundred and fifty persons, including eighty-six free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; the chapel of St. George, in Sowerby, which affords accommodation to six hundred persons, including two hundred free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; and the chapel of St. Andrew, in Stainland, which affords accommodation to five hundred and ninety persons, including one hundred and fifty free seats appropriated to the use of the poor:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to each of the said five chapels, under the pro-

visions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such districts should be named, respectively, "The Chapelry District of St. James, Halifax;" "The Chapelry District of St. Martin, Brighouse;" "The Chapelry District of St. John, Ovenden;" "The Chapelry District of St. George, Sowerby;" and "The Chapelry District of St. Andrew, Stainland;" with boundaries as follow:

"The chapelry district of Saint James, Halifax, commences at Bowling's-dyke, and proceeds in a westerly direction along the stream which divides the townships of Northowram and Ovenden from the township of Halifax, as far as Sandhall; when it proceeds south to the High-road-well, and, including the same, proceeds in an easterly direction to a lane leading in a southerly direction to Hopwood-lane; then proceeding in an easterly direction along the centre of the lane to Hopwood-road and Bull-green; whence it proceeds in a northerly direction up the centre of Silver-street, Waterhouse-street, Broad-street, Northgate, and Bowling's-dyke, to the point where the boundary commenced, as shewn on the map hereunto annexed, and tinted pink:

"The chapelry district of Saint Martin, Brighouse, is to consist of the hamlet of Brighouse; and bounded on the east by a stream which divides the hamlet of Brighouse from the township of Clifton; on the south and south west by the river Calder; on the west by a stream which separates the hamlet of Brighouse from the township of Southowram; and on the north by the township of Hipperholme, as shewn on the map, and tinted blue:

"The chapelry district of Saint John, Ovenden, is to consist of the Bradshaw division of the township of Ovenden; and is bounded on or towards the east by the township of Northowram, in the parish of Halifax; on or towards the north by the township of Haworth and Thornton, in the parish of Bradford; on the west by the township of Warley; and on the south west by the remaining part of the township of Ovenden, called Mixenden, and the Mingwarth-moor division of that township, as shewn on the map, and tinted yellow:

"The chapelry district of Saint George, Sowerby, is to consist of part of the township of Northowram and Sowerby, and commences at the point of junction of the brook Ryburn with the river Calder, and proceeds in a westerly direction, along the last-mentioned river, to a point immediately opposite to the west entrance of the tunnel of the Manchester and Leeds Railway, in the township of Sowerby; and proceeds from such point in a straight line, in a southerly direction, to the public highway leading from Sowerby-bridge, by the Bentley-royds, to Sowerby; whence it proceeds in an easterly direction along such highway, as far as Quarry-hill; it then turns westerly and southerly down the centre of the Old-road from

Sowerby-bridge to Blackstone-edge, including the two Haugh-ends and Brockwell-cottages, till it meets the Halifax and Rochdale turnpike-road; and proceeds along that road, in an easterly direction, till it meets the road leading down to the Ryburn-brook, at Watson-mill; and proceeding south westerly along the centre of that brook to the township of Barkisland; it then proceeds in a south easterly direction along the boundary, separating the township of Norland from the township of Barkisland, till it comes where the townships of Norland and Greetland meet; then in a north easterly direction it proceeds along the boundary separating the townships of Norland and Greetland, till it comes to a point directly opposite Shay (marked on the map thus \*); it then turns north till it joins the road leading to Watson-mill, by Shay and Upper Harper-royd; and then follows the old footpath to Scar-head, and proceeds along the road to Watson-mill; it then proceeds in a north easterly direction along the centre of Ryburn's-brook to its junction with the river Calder, where the boundary commenced, as shewn on the map, and tinted green:

“ The chapelry district of Saint Andrew, Stainland, is to consist of the township of Stainland; and is bounded by the townships of Barkisland and Elland-cum-Greetland, in the parish of Halifax, and the township of Longwood and Slaithwaite, in the parish of Huddersfield, as shewn on the map, and tinted brown:

“ That marriages, baptisms, churchings; and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said chapels of Saint James, Halifax; Saint John, Ovenden; and Saint George, Sowerby; and that the fees arising therefrom should be equally divided between the Ministers of the said chapels, respectively, and the Vicar of the said parish of Halifax, excepting only for so much of the district of Saint George's, Sowerby, as is formed from the township of Norland; and that the fees arising from the performance of such offices, with respect to the inhabitants of that part of the district, should be equally divided between the Minister of the said chapel at Saint George, Sowerby, and the other party entitled thereto; and that baptisms, churchings, and burials should be performed in the said chapels of Saint Martin, Brighouse; and Saint Andrew, Stainland; and that the fees arising therefrom should be equally divided between the Ministers of the said chapels, respectively, and the persons respectively entitled thereto:

“ That the consent of the Lord Bishop of Ripon has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

“ Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, with respect of the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
