Buckingham-Palace, April 25, 1843.

THIS Morning, at five minutes past four, the Queen was happily delivered of a Princess. His Royal Highness Prince Albert, several Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and the Ladies of Her Majesty's Bed-Chamber, being present.

This great and important news was immediately made known to the Town by the firing of the Park and Yower Guns; and the Privy Council being

assembled as soon as possible thereupon, at the Council-Chamber, Whitehall, it was ordered, that a Form of Thanksgiving for the Queen's safe delivery of a Princess be prepared by His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, to be used in all churches and chapels throughout England and Wales, and the Town of Berwick-upon-Tweed, on Sunday the 30th of April, or the Sunday after the respective Ministers shall receive the same.

Her Majesty and the infant Princess are, God be praised, both doing well.
