*Madrid, March 29.* His Catholick Majesty has named the Marquis de *Valparaiso* to go for *England* in Quality of his Envoy Extraordinary to make his Compliments of Condolence upon the Death of the late King of ever Blessed Memory, and to Congratulate His Majesty's Succession to the Crown. The Marquis de *Villa Garcia*, Ambassador from this Crowne at *Venice*, is appointed to go with the same Character to the Court of *France*. The 26th Instant arrived here the Marquis de *Feuquieres*, Ambassador Extraordinary from his Most Christian Majesty, who had last night a private Audience of the Duke of *Medina Celi*. We have Advice, by a Vessel arrived at *St. Lucar* the 18th Instant from the *West-Indies*, That the Galeons were the 17th of *December* last at *Vera Cruz*, kept there by the Northerly Winds which came in much sooner then they used to do, so that the Fleet cannot be expected in any of the Ports of this Kingdom till *July* or *August*. This Ship came from the *Havana* the 14th of *January*, and heard two days before that *Lorenzillo* the Pyrate, had taken the *Patatche* of *Cuba*, a Ship of 36 Guns, that went out with the Galeons.

*Warsaw, March 20.* The Dyet, after great contests, made at last choice on the 15th Instant of the *Sieur Pizars* of *Lithuania* to be their Marschal or Speaker. The Deputies of *Lithuania* who assembled at *Grodno* are not yet arrived here, but are impatiently expected, their absence putting a stop to the most important deliberations of the Dyet. In the mean time the Season advances; and there are not yet any preparations made for the Campaign. The Letters from *Lembergh* of the 3d Instant give an account that the Brother of *Mobila* General of the Cossacks understanding that the Turks and Tartars had besieged *Niemirow*, where the said General then was, he had drawn together what Troops he could and marching with great diligence had raised the Siege with a very great slaughter of the Enemy.

*Vienna, March 25.* Count *Palfi*, Lieutenant General of the Hungarian Troops, arrived here the 21st Instant from the Imperial Camp near *Newhensel*; and reports that the day before he came from thence, Colonel *Heusler* received a reinforcement of 3000 Men, and that he had an account of several other Troops that were on their march to joyn him; And with all assures us that the Turks in *Newhensel* have not Provisions to subsist longer then till the end of the next Month. The 22d arrived here an Express from the Emperors Ambassador at *Venice*, and the next day another with Letters for his Imperial Majesty from the Republick to desire, as we are told, passage through the Emperors Territories for the Troops the Senate have caused to be raised in *Germany*. Orders have been sent to all the Imperial Officers to have their

their Regiment; compleat by the end of *April*. A great number of Boats are providing for the use of the Troops of the Empire, which will be brought as far as they can by Water; and Commissaries are appointed to provide all things necessary for them; It's hoped that these Forces will all be in *Hungary* about the middle of *May*, where the general Rendezvous is intended to be held before the end of that Month. Several private Persons have advanced Two Hundred Thousand Florins upon the Monies to be raised by the Ecclesiasticks, which have been put into the Hands of Count *Rabata* Commissary General, to be employed towards the providing the Magazines he has Orders to make in the most considerable places of *Hungary*.

*Cologne, April 3.* The Deputies which our Magistrates sent to the Elector of *Trier* to pray his Interposition for the composing the Differences between the Elector of *Cologne* and this City, returned hither the 31. past; but we do not yet know the success of their Negotiation. The 600 men raised by this City for the Emperor's assistance parted from hence the 29th of the last month under the Conduct of the Count *de Thann* the Imperial Minister for *Bonne*, and we since hear that they have from thence continued their march to *Coblentz*. The Letters from *Ulm* of the 25th past inform us, that the States of *Suabia* were separated after having resolved to make up their Troops in the Emperor's Service to the number of 5000 men. They write from *Munich* that the Elector of *Saxony* passed privately through that place on the 23. of the last month in his return home from *Penice*; And that he had already given orders for the march of the 3000 men with which he has promised to assist the Republick.

*Marseilles, April 6.* They work very diligently at *Thoulon* and here on the Men of War and Gallies designed against the *Tripolins*; And it's believed that by the latter end of the next Month 15 Men of War and as many Gallies, with five Gallions for their B'mbs and Carasses will be ready to put to Sea. The *Tripolins* are fitting out all their Ships, thinking them more secure at Sea than in Port.

*Paris, April 14.* We have an account from *Genoua*, that their Doge and four Senators parted from thence the 29th past, intending to take their journey through *Savoy*. And several Gentlemen of their Train are already arrived here to prepare things for their reception, The Canal designed to be brought from the River *tire* to *Verfailles*, is begun, and *Monseigneur de Louvoy* has taken several journeys to give orders for the halting the Work.
