The Marquis de Villa Garcia, Ambaffador from this Crowa at Penice, is appointed to go with the fame Chafacter to the Court of France. St. Lucar the 18th Inflant from the West-Indies, That the Gal ons were the 1 th of Becember laft at Verd Cruz, kept there by the Northerly Winds whicy came in much fooner then they uled to do, fo that the Fleet cannot be exp. cted in any of the Ports of this Kingdom till Fuly or August. This Ship came from the Havana the 14th of Fanuary, and heard two days before that Lorenfillo the Pyrate, had taken the Patache of Cuba, a Ship of 36 Guns, that went out with the Galcons.

Warfaw, March 20. The Dyet, after great contefls, made at laft choice on the 15th Icftant of the Sieur Pizars of Lithuania to be their Marefehal or Speaker. The Deputies of Lithuania who affembled at Grodwo are not yet arrived here, but are impatiently expected, their ablence putting a flop to the moft important del.berations of the Dyer. In the mean time the Scafon advances; and there are not yet any preparations made for the Campagne. The Letters from Lembergh of the 3d Inflant give an account that the Brother of Mobila General of the Coffacks underflanding that the Turks and Tarters had befieged Niemirows, where the faid General then was, he had drawn together what Troops he could and marching with great diligence had raifed the Seige with a very great flaughter of the Enemy.

Count Palfi, Licutenant Ge-Vienna, March 25. neral of the Hungarian Troops, arrived here the aift Instant from the Imperial Camp near Newheusel; and reports that the day before he came from thence, Colonel Heusler received a reinforcement of 3000 Men, and that he had an account of feveral other Troops that were on their march to joyn him; . And withall affures us that the Turks in Newheusel have not Provisions to fubfilt longer then till the end of the next Month.
