PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to alter and amend the law relating to ecclesiastical houses of residence," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words and figures following, viz.:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to alter and amend the law relating to ecclesiastical houses of residence," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for improving the demesne lands belonging to the see of Bangor.

"Whereas by the secondly-recited Act it is enacted, that, by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions of the same Act, any arrangement may, from time to time, be made, with the consent in writing, under the corporate seal of any bishop, for the sale, transfer, or

exchange of any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments belonging to the see of such bishop; or for the purchase of other lands, tithes, or other hereditaments in lieu thereof:

And whereas by the thirdly-recited Act it is enacted, that, whenever it shall appear to be expedient to improve any episcopal house of residence, or the demesnes thereof, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the said first-recited Act provided, with the consent under the hand and episcopal seal of the bishop, to make such arrangements as may by such authority be deemed most expedient for improving any episcopal house of residence, or for improving the demesnes adjoining to any such house, by the purchase of any land, tenement, or hereditament in the immediate neighbourhood, or within the view thereof:

“ And whereas by the said thirdly-recited Act it is further enacted, that the provisions of the said secondly-recited Act, relating to the sale, transfer, or exchange of any lands or other hereditaments belonging to any bishop, shall extend and may be applied to any of the purposes of the now reciting Act:

“ And whereas the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed and marked A., are situate in the immediate neighbourhood and within the view of the demesnes of the episcopal house of residence belonging to the said see of Bangor; and it appears to us to be expedient, for the purpose of improving the said house of residence and the demesnes thereof, that the same lands, tenements, and hereditaments should be obtained and added to such demesnes, so as to become the permanent property of the said see of Bangor; and, to that end, that an exchange should be forthwith effected of the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked B., belonging to the said see of Bangor, which are inconveniently situated and far removed from the rest of the demesnes of the said see, in exchange for the said firstly-mentioned lands, tenements, and hereditaments described in the said schedule marked A.:

“ And whereas we have satisfied ourselves as to the validity of the title to the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments described in the said schedule marked A.; and that the same lands,

tenements, and hereditaments are of equal value at the least with the lands, tenements, and hereditaments described in the said schedule marked B.:

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher Bishop of Bangor, in testimony whereof he hath hereunto set his hand and episcopal seal, that he, the said Christopher Bishop of Bangor, and the persons seized of or entitled to, or having power to exchange, the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments so described in the said schedule marked B., and all other necessary or proper parties (if any) may be hereby respectively authorized and empowered, with our consent signified under our common seal, to make and execute, or cause to be made and executed, such deed or deeds as may be found necessary for fully carrying into effect the said exchange, to the intent that the fee simple and inheritance of the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, so described in the said schedule marked A., may be secured and conveyed and permanently annexed to the said see of Bangor; and to the intent that the fee simple and inheritance of the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, so described in the said schedule marked B., may be effectually conveyed and assured unto such persons, and may be limited and settled to such uses and in such manner as the several persons, who are now respectively seized of or entitled to, or have the power to exchange, the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments, so described in the said schedule marked A., may respectively direct or require:

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the said see of Bangor, in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts, or either of them.”

SCHEDULE A.

No. I. All that piece of land, containing three acres, one rood, and fourteen perches, or thereabouts, situate in the parish of Bangor, in the county of Carnarvon, and bounded on the north west side thereof by a piece of land belonging to James Wyatt, Esq., on the north east side thereof by land belonging to the said Christopher Bishop of Bangor, and on all other sides thereof by part of

the park adjoining to the episcopal house of residence, and forming part of the demesnes of the see of Bangor.

No. 2. And also all those three small detached pieces of land, containing altogether one rood and twenty-three perches, situate in the said parish of Bangor, and bounded on the north west sides thereof respectively by the road leading from Bangor to Garth-point, and on all other sides thereof by other part of the demesne lands belonging to the said see of Bangor.

No. 3. And also all that piece of land (formerly part of a piece of land called Cachir), containing three acres and fourteen perches, or thereabouts, situate in the said parish of Bangor, and bounded on the north west side thereof by the said road leading from Bangor to Garth-point; on the south east side thereof by a rivulet, called the "Bishop's River," and which separates the same from lands belonging to the trustees of the Friar's Grammar School at Bangor; on the south and south west sides thereof partly by one of the three small pieces of land lastly hereinbefore described, and partly by other part of the demesnes belonging to the said see of Bangor; and on the north and north east sides thereof partly by the piece of land, containing one acre, three roods, and twenty-nine perches, which is firstly-described in the said schedule marked B., and partly by the sea shore.

No. 4. And also all that other piece of land (formerly part of a piece of land called Cae Scybor), containing one acre, or thereabouts, situate in the said parish of Bangor, and bounded on the south east side thereof by land belonging to the Honourable Edward Gordon Douglas Pennant; on the north west side thereof by the said rivulet called the Bishop's River, and which separates the same from other part of the demesnes belonging to the said see of Bangor; on the south west side thereof by the town of Bangor; and on the north east side thereof by land belonging to the said trustees of the said Friar's Grammar School.

SCHEDULE B.

No. 1. All that piece of land (also formerly part of the said piece called Cachir), together with the several houses and other buildings erected and now standing thereon, containing (inclusively of the sites of the said houses and

buildings) one acre, three roods, and twenty-nine perches, or thereabouts, situate in the said parish of Bangor, and bounded on the north west side thereof by the said road leading from Bangor to Garth-point; on the south and south west sides thereof by the piece of land, containing three acres and fourteen perches, which is thirdly-described in the said schedule marked A.; on the south east side thereof by the sea shore; and on the north and north east sides thereof by land belonging to the said Honourable Edward Gordon Douglas Pennant.

No. 2. And also all that piece of land (formerly part of certain lands called Hiracl), together with the several houses and other buildings erected and now standing thereon, containing (inclusively of the sites of the said houses and buildings) six acres, two roods, and twenty-six perches, or thereabouts, situate in the said parish of Bangor, and bounded on the south west and north west sides thereof by land belonging to the said trustees of the said Friar's Grammar School; on the south and south east sides thereof by land belonging to the said Honourable Edward Gordon Douglas Pennant; on the east side thereof by the road leading from Bangor to Hiracl; and on the north east side thereof partly by land, now let on lease, forming part of the demesnes of the said see of Bangor, partly by the sea shore, and partly by land belonging to the devisees under the will of the late Dean Warren, and lately contracted to be sold by them to the trustees under the will of the late George Hay Dawkins Pennant, Esq.

And whereas the said scheme, together with the schedules thereunto annexed, have been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Bangor.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirtieth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for empowering and enabling the Master, Fellows, and Scholars of St. Mary Magdalene College, in the University of Cambridge, to convey and assure the advowson of and perpetual right of presentation to the rectory of Elingham, in the county of Norfolk and diocese of Norwich, to the persons, and in the manner, hereinafter mentioned.

"Whereas we did, in pursuance of the said recited Act, prepare and lay before your Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of February now last past, for severing the said rectory of Elingham from the mastership of the said college, and for authorizing the sale of the advowson of the said rectory; and by the same scheme we did, amongst other things, recommend and propose, with the consent of the Master and Fellows of the said college, and also with the consent of the Right Honourable Richard Griffin Lord Braybrooke (as Visitor of the said college), and of the Right Honourable and Reverend George Neville Grenville, the then and present Master of the said college, and, as such Master, the then and present Rector and Incumbent of the said rectory of Elingham, that the advowson of and perpetual right of presentation to the said rectory of Elingham should be severed and disannexed from the said mastership; and that the said advowson and right of presentation, together with all endowments, rights, privileges, and appurtenances thereunto belonging, might and should be sold and conveyed to such person or persons or body corporate, in such manner, and subject to such conditions, and for such price or sum of money as should be determined upon and approved by us, but not for a less price or sum of money than should be approved by the Visitor and Master of the said college for the time being; and, by our said scheme of the eleventh day of February

last, we did further recommend and propose, that nothing therein contained should prevent us from recommending and proposing other measures relating to the matters to which the same scheme applied, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act:

"And whereas at a Court, held at Buckingham-Palace on the twenty-fourth day of February now last past, your Majesty was graciously pleased to approve and ratify the said scheme by an Order in Council, which has been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act:

"And whereas, in pursuance of the said scheme of the eleventh day of February last, and by virtue of your Majesty's said Order, we did cause certain particulars to be printed, offering the said advowson of and perpetual right of presentation to the said rectory of Elingham for sale, with a form of tender for the purchase thereof annexed:

"And whereas the Reverend John Brewster Wilkinson, of Holbrook, in the county of Suffolk, Clerk, Thomas Clark Brettingham, of Brookdish-place, in the county of Norfolk, Esquire, and William Elliott Le Blanc, of New Bridge-street, Blackfriars, in the city of London, Gentleman, did, agreeably to the said printed particulars and form of tender, offer the sum of six thousand five hundred pounds for the purchase of the said advowson and perpetual right of presentation:

"And whereas the said price or sum of six thousand five hundred pounds having been approved by the said Richard Griffin Lord Braybrooke (the said present Visitor of the said college), and by the said George Neville Grenville (the said present Master of the said college), testified by their having, respectively, signed and sealed this present scheme, we have approved the said offer of the said John Brewster Wilkinson, Thomas Clark Brettingham, and William Elliott Le Blanc, to become purchasers of the said advowson and perpetual right of presentation at or for that price or sum:

"And whereas doubts are now entertained whether, in consequence of the Act of Parliament, by virtue of which the said rectory of Elingham was annexed and united to the said mastership of the said college, having rendered it unnecessary for the Master, for the time being, of the said college to be presented to the said rectory, the advowson of and right of presentation to the said rectory is now legally vested in any person or body corporate; and it is therefore expedient, in order to carry the said scheme of the eleventh day of February last, and the said sale which has been made in pursuance thereof as aforesaid, into full and complete effect, that some person or body corporate should be duly authorized and empowered to convey and assure the said advowson of and perpetual right of presentation to the said rectory unto the said John Brewster Wilkinson, Thomas Clark Brettingham, and William Elliott Le Blanc:

"We, therefore, further recommend and propose, with the consent of the Master, Fellows, and Scholars of the said college (testified by their having sealed this scheme with their common

seal), and also with the consent of the said Richard Griffin Lord Braybrooke, as Visitor of the said college, and of the said George Neville Grenville (testified by their having, respectively, signed and sealed this scheme), that the said Master, Fellows, and Scholars of the College of Saint Mary Magdalene, in the University of Cambridge, and their successors, shall be hereby authorized and empowered, with our consent (testified under our common seal), and upon the said purchase money or sum of six thousand five hundred pounds being paid to us by the said John Brewster Wilkinson, Thomas Clark Brettingham, and William Elliott Le Blanc, to convey and assure (under the common seal of the said Master, Fellows, and Scholars) the said advowson of and perpetual right of presentation to the said rectory of Elingham, together with all endowments, rights, privileges, and appurtenances thereunto belonging, unto the said John Brewster Wilkinson, Thomas Clark Brettingham, and William Elliott Le Blanc, their heirs and assigns, or to such uses as they shall direct :

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing other measures relating to the matters to which this scheme applies, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the dioceses of Norwich and Ely respectively.
