May it please your Majesty,

THE faithful States of your Majesty's island of Jersey have received, with deep concern, the sad intelligence of the demise of your Majesty's revered Uncle, His Royal Highness the Duke of Sussex, and beg leave respectfully to tender to your Majesty, the expression of their sincere sympathy and condolence on this sorrowful occasion.

Distinguished by the many virtues which have at all times so eminently adorned the various branches of your Majesty's illustrious Hause, His Royal Highness, by his constant and active benevolence, and by the encouragement ever given by him to learning and the arts, had endeared himself to your Majesty's loyal people, who now, in common with your Majesty, mourn the loss of that excellent Prince.

In conclusion, your Majesty's faithful States desire to pray to Almighty God, in whose hands are the issues of life and death, that He may be pleased to watch over and protect your Majesty's

sacred Person; and that your Majesty may long be preserved to your Royal Consort, your Family, and the Nation, over which your Majesty rules with so much wisdom and virtue.
