THE following is a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, assigning district chapelries to the chapel at Llanllwch, and also to the chapel of St. David, in the parish of St. Peter, in the county and borough of Carmarthen, under the 16th section of the 59th Geo. 3., cap. 134 :

At the Court at Windsor, the 10th of November 1843, present, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal; and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe land, tithes, moduses, or other endowments which will by such division arise and accrue, and remain and be, within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and it is by the 21st section of the said Act further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete, separate, and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein,

in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendence of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:"

And whereas by an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, in the same manner and with the like consents as are required in case of division into ecclesiastical districts under the said recited Act, or this Act, to assign a particular district to any chapel of ease or parochial chapel already existing, or to any chapel built, or which may hereafter be built or acquired under the powers of the said Act, or this Act; and such district shall be under the immediate care of the curate appointed to serve such chapel, but subject, nevertheless, to the superintendence and controul of the incumbent of the parish church; and all such curates shall be nominated by the incumbent of the parish to the bishop for his licence, except where the right of nomination shall already be legally vested in any other person or persons, and in every such case by the person or persons possessing such right of nomination, subject to all the laws in force relating to stipendiary curates, except as to the assigning of salaries to such curates; provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, to determine whether any and what part or proportion of the fees or dues for marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be assigned to any such curate; and whether banns of marriage shall be published, and marriages or baptisms, churchings or burials, shall be solemnized or performed in any such chapel or not; and in any case in which marriages shall be allowed in any such chapel, the Commissioners shall cause the boundaries of the district assigned to such chapel to be enrolled in the High Court of Chancery, and in the office of the Registry of the diocese, any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and no such chapelry shall become a benefice by reason of any augmentation of the maintenance of the curate, by any grant or bounty under the provision of any Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, for augmenting small

livings, any thing in such Act or Acts of Parliament, or law or laws, to the contrary notwithstanding :”

And whereas by another Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” and by another Act, made and passed in the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled ‘An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;’” and also by another Act, made and passed in the second and third years of His said late Majesty, intituled “An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled ‘An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;’” further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect :

And whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the thirtieth day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, in the words following, viz.

“Your Majesty’s Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” continued by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled “An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty’s reign, intituled “An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty’s Commission for building new churches;” beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, when the last census was taken, the parish of St. Peter, in the county of the borough of Carmarthen, and diocese of St. David’s, contained a population of nine thousand five hundred and twenty-six persons :

“That, besides the parish church, which affords accommodation to nine hundred persons, there are two consecrated churches or chapels in the said parish, that is to say, one at Llanllwch, which will afford accommodation to three hundred persons, all of which are free seats appropriated to the use of the parishioners at large; and the other, built by your Majesty’s said Commissioners, in the county of the borough of Carmarthen aforesaid, which will afford accommodation to one thousand and sixty-two persons, including four hundred and

ninety-eight free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; and that divine service is regularly performed in the said chapels :

“Your Majesty’s said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, that particular districts should be assigned to each of the said chapels, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;” and that such districts should be respectively named, “The Chapelry District of Llanllwch,” and “The Chapelry District of St. David,” with boundaries as follow :

“The district of Llanllwch is bounded on the north by the parish of New Church, otherwise Llan Newydd; on the north west by the parish of Merthyr; on the south west by the parishes of Llangynog and Llangain; on the south by the parish of Llandyfaelog; on the south east by the river Towy, till it is joined by the Tavelan river; and on the north east by pursuing the course of that river till it crosses the road leading to Job’s-well, from John’s-town; along the middle of which road it proceeds till it enters the road leading to Giddy-moor, and taking the middle of that road till it again meets the Tavelan river, along which it proceeds, in a northerly direction, till it enters the parish of New Church, or Llan Newydd, where the boundary commenced, as shewn on the map, and thereon coloured green :

“The boundary of the district of St. David is to commence at the river Towy, by the bridge which crosses the said river, and proceeds in a north western direction along the middle of the road leading from Bridge-street to and along Bridge-street to the point where the same joins Lower Bridge-street; and afterwards, in a northward direction, along the middle of Bridge-street, leaving the island or cluster of houses, near the fish-market, on the right, and passing the east end of St. Mary’s-street, and the west side of the fish-market, to the east end of Lower Market-street, near the Cross; and thence, in a westward direction, along the middle of Lower Market-street, and passing along the north end or side of the Townhall into Guildhall-square; and thence, in a westward direction, along the middle of the Guildhall-square to the south end of Red-street; and thence, in a northerly direction, along the middle of Red-street, and the road leading by Barn’s-row, by Waterloo-terrace, in a northerly direction, along the middle of the road leading to Penlanarcoed; it then takes a straight line, in a north westerly direction, to Cwmdru, till it reaches the river Tavelan, which forms the boundary line separating part of the parish of St. Peter, in the county of the borough of Carmarthen, from the parish of New Church, or Llan Newydd, along which river it proceeds, in a southerly direction, till it meets the road leading from Giddy-moor to

Job's-well, and proceeding along the middle of the road passing Job's-well; and thence to John's-town, till it again meets the Tavelan river, along which it proceeds, in a south easterly direction, to its entrance into the Towy river; and then, in a north easterly direction, along that river to Carmarthen-bridge, crossing the Towy, where the boundary commenced, as is shewn on the map, and thereon coloured pink:

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in each of the said chapels; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the respective Ministers of the said chapels:

"That the consent of the Lord Bishop of St. David's has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Lord Bishop has signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, beg leave to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignments be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
