Ma-cers of Our Privy Council, Fursevants, and Messeng rs at Arms, Our Sheriffs in that part, conjunctly and seveg rs at Arms, Our Sperifys in that part, computity and seve-rally, specially constitute. As like-wife, We hereby Require and Command all Our Liedges on the Sea coasts of this Kingdom, or near to them, or to any of the Iflands thereunto belonging, so soon as they hear, or get notice of any Veffels arriving at any place from abroad, or at bome into any Coasts, Ports, Creiks, or Harbours, with Men, Arms or Ammunition, fortbrith to Convocat, and rife in their best Arms, and to Beat them off, or feize upon, and secure the Ships or Veffels, and the Men, Arms and Ammunition, and give immediate Advertisement to Our Privy Council. And for ibeir Security in obeying these Our Royal Commands, We bereby fully Pardon and Indemnific them for ever, of all Slaughter, Blood, Mutilation, Fire raifing, burning of Ships, or fuch like Warlike Inconveniencies as may follow, in cafe they meet with Holfile opposition : And We hereby Require and Command all Our Collectors, Cultomers, or Waiters to make ftrift and Diligent Search and Inquiry in all Ships, arriving in any part of thu Kingdom, for Trastors, Rebels, Fugitues, or Difaffeeled Perjons. and for Arms and Ammunition, and to feize upon the Ships, Men, Arms, and Ammunition until they acquaint Our Privy Council, and receive their Directions thereanent : And to the effect they may the better be able to perform this Service, We do Require all Our Subjects nearess to them, as they shall be by them Advertised to Rise, Concur with, Fortifie and Assist them, who, and these to assist, are bereby Declared to be fully Indemnified in mannner foresaid. And that all the persons aforesaid may know their bazard, if they fail in any of the Premisses. We hereby declare, That they shall not only incur Our high Displeasure, but also shall be puwished with the outmost of feverity, conform to their Demerit, and the Laws and Practice of this Kingdom, and that the Heretors which shall be Deficient in sending out their Tenents, and other Finfible men, or shall not give adversifement as faid is, and of any Rebels and Traytors appearing on their Lands, that they shall be punified accordingly. And to the end the said Desperat Traytors and Rebels may have no Reset, Harbour, Comfors or Refuge from any of the Subjects of this Our Realm. We bereby firstilly Prohibit and Difebarge all and every of Our Subjetts therein, to furnish House, Meat, Drink, or any other this comfortable to them, or to keep Intelligence, or Correfoondence with them, by Word, Writ. or Megage, or to Tranfport them to or from Ferries, or any ways to be aiding, abating or allifting to them, under the pain of being Repute and effee-med Art and Part with them in all their wicked Deeds and Practices, and proceeded against, Demeaned and Punished ac-cordingly, And that Our Pleasure in the Fremises may be fully inown to all our Leidges. OUR WILL is, and We Charge you striffly and Command, that incontinent these Our Letters ken, ye pass to the Mercat Cross of Edinburgh, and all the other Mercas Croffes of the Head-Burgs of the Shires of this Kingdom (and all places elfe needful) and there by open Proclamation, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication of Our Royal Will and Pleasure in the Premises, that none presend ignorance.
