AT the Court at *Buckingham-Palace*, the 31st day of *January* 1844,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the ninth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for providing a temporary endowment for the archdeaconry of Bangor.

"Whereas it is by the first-recited Act enacted, that, with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, any archdeaconry may be endowed, amongst other modes, by augmentation out of the common fund

in the said Act mentioned, provided that such augmentation shall not raise the average annual income of any archdeaconry to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds, and provided that no archdeacon shall be entitled to hold such endowment unless he shall be resident for the space of eight calendar months in every year within the diocese in which his archdeaconry is situate, or as to any then archdeacon within the diocese in which his archdeaconry was situate before the passing of the Act in the same Act first recited; but subject to the same provisions as to licences for non-residence which are enacted, with respect to incumbents of benefices, by an Act relating to pluralities and the residence of the clergy; passed in the second year of your Majesty's reign:

"And whereas by the secondly-recited Act it is enacted, that, from and after the passing thereof, the dignities and offices of Archdeacon of Bangor and Archdeacon of Anglesea should be dis severed from the bishoprick of Bangor, and be no longer holden by the Bishop of Bangor, and the archdeaconry of Anglesea should be incorporated with and form part of the archdeaconry of Bangor; provided, that nothing therein contained should affect any lands, tithes, tenements, or other hereditaments or endowments then forming part of the property and revenues of the see of Bangor:

"And whereas those parts of the diocese of Bangor which heretofore constituted the said archdeaconries of Bangor and Anglesea, so consolidated as aforesaid, are now without any archidiaconal jurisdiction or superintendence whatsoever, and the whole annual emoluments of the said archdeaconry of Bangor do not exceed ten pounds:

"And whereas the archdeaconry of Merioneth is endowed by the annexation thereto of certain lands, tenements, and hereditaments:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher

Bishop of Bangor, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that he the said Bishop may and shall forthwith collate some fit and proper person to the dignity or office of Archdeacon of the archdeaconry of Bangor; and that the right of collating to the said archdeaconry of Bangor shall be exercised by the said Bishop of Bangor and his successors, Bishops of Bangor, for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that until arrangements shall be recommended and proposed by us, and ratified by your Majesty in Council, under the provisions of the secondly-recited Act, for permanently annexing a canonry residentiary in the cathedral church of Bangor to the said archdeaconry of Bangor, and for duly endowing such canonry, the said archdeaconry of Bangor shall be endowed by augmentation out of the common fund in the said first-recited Act mentioned, and that accordingly there shall be paid by us, on the first day of January in every year, to the Archdeacon of Bangor for the time being, so long as he shall duly reside within the said diocese, the annual sum of one hundred and ninety pounds out of the monies from time to time carried over to such common fund, on production to us of a certificate, under the hand of the Bishop of Bangor for the time being, that such Archdeacon has duly resided during the preceding year, and that a proportionate part of such sum of one hundred and ninety pounds shall be made on the first day of January next following the day of the first appointment of an Archdeacon of Bangor after the date of this scheme; and that whenever a vacancy in the said archdeaconry shall happen on any other day than the first day of January, the then next yearly payment shall be duly apportioned and paid between the archdeacon making the vacancy, or his representatives, and the archdeacon succeeding to the said archdeaconry.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Bangor.
