Genqua, Alay 2.

Hey write from Milan that the Count de Melgan, their Governor, has put the Troops of that Country into a very good pollure; and that it's believed fome of them will be (ent to the affiliance of the Emperor. We have advice

that the Venetians have fulfored fome lofs before Singn; and that the Senate hath refolved to make only a defensive War in Dalmatia and an offensive one by Sea. We have an account from Legborn that four Gallies are fitting out there, which the Great Duke intends to fend to the Levant with the Popes Gallies to joyn the Venetian Fleet.

Kenice, April 31, The last Letters from Dalmaria gave an account, That the Proveditore General Valier after having made himfelf Mailer of the Fort of Cetting, marched to attack Sings, where there was a Gurifon of 500 Turks, That having polled his Troops round the place and raifed feveral Batteries, he fent to Summon the Garifon, but that the Governor answered he was resolved to defend the place to the laft, upon which the Venetians began ; fire ppon the Belieged, and employed their Cannon with that fuccefs, that baving made large breaches in the Wall of the Town, the Enemy hung out a White Flag; but a great body of Turks commanded by three Ba fa's atriving before Jingn at the time the Garifon was going to Capitulate, the Venetians were forced to retire in fome hafte and diforder with the lofs of 200 men, two Pieces of Cannon, and part of their Baggage. This week 16 Weffels laden with Troops and Ammunition failed for Corfu to joyn the Fleet. The 1sth Inflant 2600 men of the Troops of Hanouer arrived at the Lido ; They are put into quarters of refreihment, and are to embark in few days for Dalmatia. The Pyrates of Duleigno have lately taken 3 or 4 Fisher Boats and fome other finall Veficies.

Vanua, April 26. The Articles of Marriage between the Elector of Bavaria and the Archduckels are all agreed; and his Electoral Highnell's Anaballadors have thereupon had their publick Audience of the Emperor, the Emptels, and the Archduchels. We have advice from the Turkilly Territories that the Turks intend to have a very great Army in Hungary this Summer, and that the Grand Signior will be in Perfon at the general Rendezvons near Belgnade, but that they will act only defensively on the fide of Polanth and Dalmania. The Prince of Hanouer is come into Monavia with the Troops hunder his comment for 10 or 14 days, and then, they are to march towards Nonbeulely which place will, it's believed, be formally Befaced before the end of the next month; all our advices confirm that the Turks there are ingreat want of Provisions.

Hamburgh, May 6. The Differences between the Duke of Zell and this City are not yet compoled, but the Negotiation is in fuch a flate, that there is no reason to doubt the good fuccess of it. We have an account from Berlin, that the Baron Freysag, the Emperors Minister at that Court, does follicite a succor of y or & doo men against the Turks, which his Elestoral Highnels does not refuse, that proposes Con-

ditions which the Emperor docs not very well like. They write from Copenbagen that the Count de Roje Marefchal de Camp-General of the King of Denmarks Forces, was returned thither from France. And that The Kings journey to Holflein is put off till towards the end of this Month. The Letters from Warfaw of the 13th paft, told us, that the Dyet was prolonged for feveral days notwichflanding the opposition of fome of the Deputies, and that it was believed it would be continued till Eafter; That as yet they had not taken any refolutions concerning the War against the Turks, and that confequently there was not any preparations made for the Campagne, fo that it was feared the King would be only able to aft defenfively this Summer.

Bruffels, May 11. His Catholick Majefty has made four new Scricants-General of Batallia, Count Tilly de Serclaes, the Baron d'Autell, Monfigur de Preux, and Monfieur Salcedo; And the first of thefe is going for Hungar) with a Troop of a hundred reformed Officers to ferve there this Campagne. They write from Liege of the 9th Inftant, that the Electors Troops were to begin their march towards Hangary the next day. The Letters from Vienna of the 26th paft tell us, that the Soraiquier who commanded the Turk.In Army in Hungary the last Campagne, is removed from that Command, and made Baffa of Caminice ; and that the Balla that defended Buda the laft year is made Serafquier; And that the Turks pretend to have a great Army in Hungary this Summer.

Hague, May 18. The States of Holland and Welf-Frizeland re-affembled the 16th Inftant; And it's believed they will now come to a refolution concerning the flate of the War. The Sieur Camprich the Imperial Minister, has given in another Memorial to the States General, demanding payment of the Arrears of Sublidies that remain due to the Emperor. The Prince and Pringels of Orange returned hither laft Saturday from Dieren. And on Monday Prince Caffinir of Naffam Stadtholder of Frizeland arrived here from Leemaeriden.

Paris, May 9. On Friday last arrived here an Express from the Princes de Comi and de la Roch-Sur-Yon, by whom we understand, That they have changed their intention of going for Hangary, and that they are now isoloved to pass the Campagne in the Venetian Army in Dalmatiat The Count de Soiffons, it's faid, is to command the Troops which the Duke of Savoy gives to that Republick. We have an account of the death of the Sieur de Guilleragues, Ambalfador from this Crown at Constantinople, where he died spidainly.

¹ Paria, May 16. Yefterday Signior Francisco Maria Imperiale Lercaro, Doge of Genoua, and the four Senators, Signior Gianettino Garibaldi, Signior Agofino Lomellino, Signior Maria Salvago, and Signior Marcello Durazzo, had Audience of the King being conducted by the Sieur de Bonneuil Introductor of Ambailadors, (not having with them a Marcfehal of France, as was offered, because the Doge refuled to give him the Hand in his own Houle.) They were carried to Verfailles in the Coaches of the King and the Dauphinels, followed by two of the Doges own Coaches (which were very magnificent, thefirth being drawn by eight Horles) two of the Senators, one of the Genoucle Minifter refiding here, and a numerous Train
