There have been likewife prefented to his Majefty very Loyal Addresses from the Bilhop, the Dean and Chapter, and Clergy of the Church and Dioceis of St. Afaph. From the Bifhop and Clergy of the Diocels of Landaffe. And from the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen and Capital Burgeffes and other Gentlemen, Freemen and Inhabitants of the Borough of Stamford, which his Majefly received very gracioully. Vienna, April 29. The Baffa's of Buda and Agria

are drawing all the Troops they can together to luccour Newbeufel, for which purpole 10000 men are already in a body near Buda; To prevent their de-fign Colonel Heufler has posted himself near Lements, having with him about 9000 men reckoning the Troops of Hungary commanded by Counr Palfi; And he has fent an Express hither to defire a speedy reinforcement; Upon which orders have been fent to the Troops of Zell, Hanouer and Wolfembussel, who make together 10000 men3, and are now in quarters of refreshment in Moravia, to flay there but eight days, and then to march towards Lementz to joyn Colonel Heusler : And 2000 Bavarians, who paf-Icd the last week by this place going for Hungary, have likewife orders to joyn him. We have advice that the Troops of Croatia have made an Incursion into the Turkish Territories, and that they have plundred and burnt the little Town of Buzin and feyeral Bourgs and Villages, and that they are returned with a great number of Prifoners and a very confiderable Bosty. We have not lately had any cersai news of Count Teckeley, but the general report is, that he is retired with his Wife and Children to Thourne, whire he expects fuccor from the Turks. ger, and the Baron de Bergheim Amballadors Extraordinary from the Elector of Bavaria, had publick Audience of the Emperor to demand the Archduchefs Mary in Marriage for his Electoral Highness, after which they had Audience of the Archdutcheis who was accompanied with a great many Ladies of the first Quality and the Prince of Dietrichstein, Great Mafter of the Emperor's Houshold, and other the principal Miniflers of this Court. The Ambaffadors having made their Compliment to the Archdutchels and prayed her to give her confent to the demand they came from making to his Imperial Majefty, She answered, That She would follow the Will of the Emperor; Whereupon the Ambaffadors having given her thanks, prefented her in the Name of his Electoral Highnes, with a Jewel, a Ring, and Necklace of Pearl to a great value. In the Even-ing there was a Ball and Comedy at Court, to which his Electoral Highness's Ambassadors with the other Foreign Ministers were invited. The Emperor, the Empress, and the Archdutchess have fince been Complimented by all the Foreign Ministers refiding here, and the fourth of *June* is appointed for the Cele-bration of the Marriage. The Duke of Lorra.m parted from hence the 26th Inflant to accompany

the Queen his Wife to Insprucke. Ratisbonne, May 1. The Bilhop of Paffam, whom the Emperor has nominated to be his Principal Commillioner at the Dyet, is expected here the next week, his Baggage being already arrived. The 29th paft 2000 men of the Troops which the Electors of Mentz and of Trier and the City of Cologne fend to the Emperor's affifiance, arrived here: They came by Water from Ulm commanded by the Count de Daun, and having refreshed themselves in this City, they continued their way in the fame manner towards Hungary The Envoy from the Duke of Zell hath fent from hence nine Veffels laden with Ammunition and Provisions for the fervice of the Troops with which that Prince does affift his Imperial Majefty. The Troops of Suabia, Franconia, and the Upper

Rbin having not yet begun their march. Bruffels, May 20. The Letters from Liege of the 17th Instant give us an account, that the Elector of Cologne's Troops began their march the day before towards Hungary, being to pais through the Dutchy of Limburg. The Marquis de Grand is gone with the whole Court to Marimont, where they will flay a month or fix weeks. The Marquis de Bedmar, General of the Artillery, parted from hence this day on his journey for Spain. The Letters from Vienna of the 30th past tell us, That Colonel Heufler had taken 400 head of Cattle defigned for the relief of Newbeufel, the Garifon whereof was reduced to that necellity that they had begun to fend out of the Town all perfons that were unfit to bear Arms,

Marseilles, May 14. The Duke de Mortemar is expected here this Evening from Paris, to command the Gallies which as well as the Men of War and Galiots with Mortar Pieces, fitted at Thoulon, are now ready to fail. This week the Envoy of Argiers returned hither from Paris with an Order for the releafement of the Algerine Captives that remain in the French Gallies, which was accordingly performed, and a Man of War from Thoulon is appointed to carry Since
