T the Court at Buckingham-Palace, the 17th day of April 1844,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to carry into effect, with " certain modifications, the fourth report of the " Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and "Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act " to explain and amend two several Acts relating " to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for Eng-" land;" and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for " regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled to be expedient, that the limitations in the said

"An Act to carry into effect, with cer-" tain modifications, the fourth report of the " Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and "Revenues;" and of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to explain and amend two several Acts re-" lating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for " England;" and of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for " regulating the cathedral churches of Wales," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making additional provision for the cure of souls in certain parishes where such assistance is most required:

"Whereas, under the authority of the said recited Acts, we have, from time to time, prepared and laid before your Majesty in Council certain schemes, in which we have recommended and proposed that certain grants should be made, in augmentation of the incomes of certain benefices and churches, in certain classes, and subject to certain limitations therein mentioned; which schemes have been ratified by Orders of your Majesty in Council, and such Orders have been duly gazetted;

" And whereas it appears to us, upon further considering the amount of the funds now applicable to the purposes of the said recited Acts, Orders mentioned should be varied, by forthwith extending the first class therein mentioned, so as to include therein benefices and churches having a population below five hundred and an average annual net income below eighty pounds, and to the raising such income as nearly as may be to that amount; and by forthwith extending the second class therein mentioned, so as to include therein any benefice or church having an average annual net income below two hundred pounds:

"And whereas we have satisfied ourselves, after due inquiry, that the benefices and churches described in the schedules hereunto annexed, marked A. 1, A. 2, and A. 3, fall within the first of such classes, subject to the respective limitations in the said Orders mentioned; and that the benefices and churches described in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked A. 4, fall within the same class, as limited by the said Orders, or as so proposed to be extended as aforesaid; and that all the said benefices and churches are fit and proper to be forthwith augmented by the respective annual amounts stated in the last column of the said schedules respectively:

" And whereas from the source set opposite to the name of each of the benefices and churches described in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked B., in the sixth column of such schedule, the benefaction stated in the seventh column of the same schedule has either been paid to us on account of such benefice or church, or permanently secured to the incumbent thereof, as therein respectively specified; and we have satisfied ourselves that the said last-mentioned benefices and churches fall within the second of such classes, as limited by the said Orders, or as so proposed to be extended as aforesaid; and are fit and proper to be forthwith augmented, by the respective annual amounts stated in the last column of the same schedule:

"And whereas the benefices and churches described in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked C., fall within the third class in the said Orders mentioned, and are situate within the places set opposite to the names thereof, respectively, in the fifth column of the same schedule; and certain tithes or lands now vested in us arise or are situate in such places respectively; and,

after due inquiry and consideration, we have satisfied ourselves that the same benefices and churches are fit and proper to be forthwith augmented, by the respective annual amounts stated in the last column of the same schedule:

" And whereas arrangements have been made for appropriating to the churches of Christ Church New Mill and St. Peter, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, mentioned in the said schedule marked A. 1, and of Copmanthorpe with Upper Poppleton and St. John Oakfield, mentioned in the said schedule marked A. 3, the fees arising within their respective districts, whereby the emoluments of the incumbents of the churches mentioned in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked D., will be diminished by the amount of the annual sums set opposite to the names of such churches, respectively, in the last column of the same schedule. and it is in our opinion expedient that compensation should be made to the incumbents thereof for the loss so sustained:

" And whereas in the case of the district church of Kimberworth, contained in the said schedule marked A. 1, application was made to us before the proceedings for legally assigning a district thereto were fully completed, and in the case of the perpetual curacy of West Molesey, contained in the said schedule marked B., possession of the house of residence in the seventh column of the said schedule mentioned was given to the incumbent of the said perpetual curacy before the first day of November last, and in the cases of the vicarages of Alderbury, Alton Pancras, and Newbald, contained in the said schedule marked C., application was long since made to us, but our decision was postponed during the necessary investigation of the respective local claims; and whereas, also, in the case of the said vicarage of Newbald we, in the first instance, resolved to recommend an annual payment of ninety-five pounds, but possession has since been given to the vicar thereof of certain land vested in us, of the computed annual value of forty pounds, and which land we intend to recommend to be permanently annexed to the said vicarage, in part of such intended augmentation:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the incumbent for the time being of each of the benefices and churches so described in the said schedules, marked respectively A. 1, A. 2, A. 3, B, C, and D, the fixed annual sum set opposite to the name of such benefice or church, in the last column of the said schedules respectively, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year; but in the case of Mansfield, contained in the said schedule A. 1, not after the first day of May or the first day of November, as the case may be, next following the completion of the commutation of the vicarial tithes thereof; and that the first such half-yearly payment shall in such case be made on the first day of May next; except in the cases of Kimberworth, West Molesey, Alderbury, and Alton Pancras aforesaid, the incumbents whereof respectively shall, on such last-mentioned day, receive two such half-yearly payments; and except also in the said case of Newbald, the vicar whereof shall on such last-mentioned day receive four such half-yearly payments, the first and second being at the rate of ninety-five pounds per annum, instead of the rate specified in the said schedule; and that in case of a vacancy in any of the benefices or churches contained in the said four schedules having already happened during the period over which the payment so recommended and proposed extends, or hereafter happening on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the incumbent making the vacancy, or his personal representatives, and the incumbent succeeding to the benefice or church so becoming vacant.

" And whereas we have satisfied ourselves that the several benefices and churches, contained in the schedule hereunto annexed marked E., also fall within the second class aforesaid, except the churches of Muswell-hill and Newbald, which fall within the third class aforesaid; we, therefore, recommend and propose, that, in order to provide fit houses of residence for the incumbents of all the benefices and churches contained in the last-mentioned schedule, we shall be at liberty to pay, to such persons and at such time or times as shall appear to us from time to time to be expedient, such a sum or sums of money, in the case of each such benefice or church, as shall be required for providing a fit house of residence for the incumbent thereof; provided that (except in the cases of the two last-named benefices) the total amount so paid by us, in addition to the amount of the benefaction, shall not exceed such amount where the benefice or church is in public patronage, nor two third parts of such amount where the benefice or church is in private patronage.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure for making better provision for the cure of souls, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them."

the authority therein provided, and with the consents of the respective patrons, for permanently uniting such preferment with such benefice:

- " Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Master and Fellows of the said College of Balliol, in testimony whereof they have affixed their corporate seal hereto, that the said rectory and vicarage of Duloe shall be forthwith permanently united and consolidated, and the same shall become and be one benefice with cure of souls, by the name of the Rectory of Duloe; and that the said Robert Scott shall thereupon become and be Rector of such rectory, and he and his successors, Rectors of the same rectory, shall be entitled to all the emoluments both of the said sinecure rectory and of the said vicarage, and that the rectory of Duloe shall, after such union as aforesaid, be in the patronage of the Master and Fellows of the said College of Balliol for ever.
- "And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the said rectory of Dulce, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."
