WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the

third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twelfth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for uniting the sinecure rectory of Duloe, in the county of Cornwall, and in the diocese of Exeter, with the vicarage of Duloe, in the same county and diocese.

"Whereas by the said Act it is enacted, that, with respect to any benefice with cure of souls which is held together with, or in the patronage of, the holder of any prebend or other sinecure preferment belonging to any college in either of the Universities, arrangements may be made, by
