kindly receiveed, that the Soldiers with great cagerneis had bought their Bread, giving them what they demanded : That they had been carried before the Balla, who encouraged them to bring a greater quantity of Bread and fom: Corn, alluring them they should have what price they would for it ; And that they were told by fom: of the Inhabitants that the Garifon was reduced to 13 or 1400 men, and that they were in that want of Provisions that they could not jublift much longer without relief. The Elector of Bavaria's Ambailadors have had their Audiences of leave of the Emperor, the Empreis, and the Archdutchels, in order to their return nome.

Ratubonne, May 16. The Letters from Vienna of the 14th Initant tell us, that the Troops of Lunenburg were on their murch towards Newbeufel, and that to foon as they have joyned Colonel Heufler, he will formally atrack that place, the Gari on where of as we are affured from all hands, is reduced to the laft extremity. That the Count de Daun was arrived at Vienna with 2000 men of the Iroops of the Electors of Mentz and Trier and of the City of Cologne; and that a confiderable fum of Money was fent to Gran and other the frontier places of Hungary to pay those Garifons.

Hamburgh, May 18. The Letters from Warfaw of the 4th Initant fay the Dyet was not yet ended, the Deputies spending their time in Disputes and fruitles They write from Berlin that the Baron Debates. de Freytag the Imperial Minister, does very much prefs the Elector of Brandenburg to affilt the Emperor with part of his froops against the Turks, which his Electoral Highness is very well enclined to, but they cannot agree upon the Conditions. From Stockholm we have an account that the King of Sweden had refolved to build 10 or 12 new Men of War this Summer; three at Stockbolm, which are to carry from 70 to 80 pieces of Cannon; two at Calmar of the fame force, two at Carelfbaven, one at Carelfcroon, and three at Riga, these to carry from 40 to 50 Guns. 7 hev write from Copenbagen that the King of Denmark has given leave to leveral of his Officers to go and ferve in Hungary this Summer.

Hague, May 25. Prince Cafimir of Naffaw, Stadtholder of Frizeland and Groningen, parted from h.nce on Sunday last to return to Leewaerden, he passed through Amflerdam but did not see any of the Magistrates of that City. The Prince and Princels of Orange are gone to Honflaerdyke to paisa month The States of Holland have not or fix weeks there. yet taken a final refolution concerning the flate of the War, and it's believed they will adjourn withour d ing it, till the 15th of July. Yellerday Prince Waldeck rec. ived by an Express a Letter from the Emperor, inviting him to pais the approaching Campagne in Hungary, and it's faid he has thereupon refolved to part from hence in few days on his journey The Duke of Saxe Gotha who has been thinher. here 8 or 10 days, went yesterday to Amsterdam, and from thence will return home.

The Doge and Senators of Ge-Parie, May 26 NOHA were again at Verfailles on Wednefday laft and appeared at the Kings riling, after which they went to pay their Respects to the Dauphin and Dauphines, and were entertained at Dinner by the Kings Officers; They will, we are told, have their Audience of leave the next week. The laft week arrived here two Ambaffadors from the Czars of Mofcovy ; who had Audierce of the King the 22. Inflant, being conducted in the Kings Coach, accompanied with the Maref-chal d'Humjeres and the Introductor of Ambassa They prefented to his Molt Christian Madors: jefty in the Name of the Czars feveral pieces of Perfian Silks and rich Furs. After which the Commons returned to their Houle and unanimoufly made choice of Sir John Trever one of the Kings Council at Law, to be their Speaker, who being this afternoon accordingly prefented to his Majefty feated on His Throne in the Houfe of Lords, his Majefty did gracioully approve of him.
