The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-first day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to carry into effect, with certain modifications, " the fourth report of the Commissioners of " Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making better provision for the spiritual duties of the parish of Maidstone, in the county of Kent and diocese of Canterbury:

" Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, with an especial view to the better care of populous parishes, that arrangements may, from time to time, be made, by the authority therein provided, for improving the value or making a better provision for the spiritual duties of ill-endowed parishes or districts, by means of such alterations in the exercise of patronage as may be agreed upon by patrons, with the consent of the bishop; and it is by the same Act further enacted, that arrangements may be made, by the like authority, for the apportionment of the income of two benefices, belonging to the same patron, between the incumbents or ministers of such benefices, or the churches or chapels connected therewith; provided, that no such arrangement shall be made, in any case, so as to prejudice the interests of any existing incumbent, nor without the consent of the bishop of the diocese :

" And whereas the perpetual curacy of Maidstone, in the said county of Kent and diocese of Canterbury, is a populous parish within the meaning of the said Act, and the patronage thereof is vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being; and there is within, and connected with, such parish a certain church or chapel, called " The Holy Trinity, Maidstone," with a chapelry district duly assigned thereto, and the patronage of the said church or chapel is at present vested in the perpetual curate for the time being of Maidstone

aforesaid, and the net average annual income of the minister of such last-mentioned church or chapel does not exceed the sum of three hundred and fifty pounds, and the population of the said district amounts to nine thousand three hundred at the least :

“ And whereas the Archbishop of Canterbury, for the time being, is also patron of the rectory of Cliffe, at Hoo, in the same county, and in the deanery of Shoreham, the peculiar and immediate jurisdiction of the cathedral and metropolitanical Church of Christ, Canterbury; and the net average annual income of the rector thereof exceeds one thousand two hundred and fifty pounds, and the population of the parish of Cliffe, at Hoo, is below nine hundred :

“ And whereas it has been agreed by the Reverend William Vallance, the present incumbent of the said perpetual curacy of Maidstone, to transfer the patronage and right of nomination of the minister of the said church or chapel of the Holy Trinity, Maidstone, to the Archbishop of Canterbury, for the time being; with a view to the permanent augmentation of the income of the minister thereof, in manner hereinafter-mentioned; and application has been made to us, to make arrangements for such transfer, and for apportioning the incomes of the said rectory and of the said chapel, between the rector of the said rectory and the minister of such chapel, in manner following; and it appears to us to be expedient that such transfer and apportionment should be forthwith carried into effect :

“ We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Archbishop of Canterbury, and of the said Reverend William Vallance, in testimony whereof they have respectively hereunto set their hands and seals, that the patronage of and right of nomination of the minister to the said church or chapel of the Holy Trinity, Maidstone, shall forthwith be transferred to and absolutely vested in the said William Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors Archbishops of Canterbury, for ever.

“ And whereas an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the second and third years of your Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to make better provision for the assignment of ecclesi-

astical districts to churches or chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes,” contains the following recital and enactments, that is to say:

“ And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the more permanent security of the endowments and emoluments which shall have been, or may hereafter be, provided for the use or benefit of any church or chapel, whether built, acquired, or appropriated, or to be built, acquired, or appropriated, under the authority of the said recited Acts, or any of them, or under any other authority, or for the use or benefit of the incumbent of any such church or chapel, or of the spiritual person serving the same, be it, therefore, enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne to accept, take, and hold any such endowments and emoluments upon the trusts, and for the intents and purposes for which the same shall have been, or may hereafter be, given or granted by the person or persons providing the same, in like manner as any such endowments or emoluments may now be taken or held by any private trustees or trustee, and it shall and may be lawful for any trustees or trustee of any such endowments or emoluments to assign and transfer the same to the said Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, to be held and applied by them upon the same trusts, and for the same intents and purposes, as the same, previously to such assignment and transfer, were held by such trustees or trustee; provided always, that no such gift, grant, assignment, or transfer shall be made to the said Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne until, by an instrument in writing under their common seal, they shall have signified their consent to accept the same :

“ And be it further enacted, that, in all cases in which such consent of the said Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne shall have been so given, the money provided for such endowments shall be paid to the Treasurer, for the time being, of the said Governors; and the receipt or receipts of such Treasurer shall be effectual discharges or an effectual discharge for so much money as in such receipts or receipt shall be expressed to the person or persons paying the

“ same; and, after obtaining such receipts or receipt, the person or persons paying such money shall be absolutely discharged from all liability touching such money, and from all trusts relating thereto :”

“ And whereas the said church or chapel of the Holy Trinity, Maidstone, was built under the provisions of one or more of the Acts referred to in the said last-recited enactments :

“ And whereas the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne have, by an instrument in writing under their common seal, bearing date the sixteenth day of May instant, signified their consent to accept the annual sum hereinafter recommended to be paid at the times and upon the trust mentioned :

“ We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that, from and immediately after the next avoidance of the said rectory of Cliffe at Hoo, there shall be paid by the rector of the said rectory, for the time being, out of the revenues of the said rectory, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year, to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, by their Treasurer for the time being, but in trust for the incumbent or minister, for the time being, of the said church or chapel of the Holy Trinity, Maidstone, the clear annual sum of one hundred pounds; and the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of January or the first day of July next following the day of such avoidance; and if a vacancy in such church or chapel shall happen on any other day than the first day of January or the first day of July, the then next half-yearly payment shall, by the said Governors or their Treasurer, be apportioned between and paid to the incumbent or minister making such vacancy, or his personal representatives, and the incumbent or minister succeeding to such church or chapel; and the said annual sum of one hundred pounds, and each and every instalment thereof, is and are hereby charged upon the said revenues, and upon all the glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, dues, profits, and emoluments whatsoever, which of right do, shall, or may belong to the said rectory, or to the rector thereof for the time being, as such rector.

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“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the said rectory, or to the said perpetual curacy, or to the said chapelry district, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act, or any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council, now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Canterbury. *C. WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;” and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;” and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England;” have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in

Council, the following scheme, respecting the mode of appointing honorary canons in certain cathedral churches, and the regulations to which they shall be subject.

"Whereas it was by the first-recited Act enacted, that honorary canonries should be thereby founded in every cathedral church in England in which there were not already founded any non-residentiary prebends, dignities, or offices; and that the holders of such canonries should be styled honorary canons, and should be entitled to stalls, and to take rank in the cathedral church next after the canons, and should be subject to such regulations respecting the mode of their appointment, and otherwise, as should be determined on by the authority thereinafter provided, with the consent of the chapters of the said cathedral churches respectively; and that the number of such honorary canonries thereby founded in each cathedral church should be twenty-four; and it should be lawful for the archbishops and bishops, respectively, if they should think fit, from time to time, to appoint spiritual persons to such honorary canonries; provided that not more than eight of such honorary canons should be appointed in any diocese within the year next after the passing of the said Act, nor more than two in any subsequent year, except in the case of the vacancy of any honorary canonry by death, resignation, or otherwise; and it was provided, that no emolument whatever, nor any place in the chapter of any cathedral church, should be taken or held by any honorary canon in virtue of his appointment as such canon; and it was by the secondly-recited Act declared and enacted, that such honorary canonries were and should be founded forthwith in the cathedral churches of Canterbury, Bristol, Carlisle, Chester, Durham, Ely, Gloucester, Norwich, Oxford, Peterborough, Ripon, Rochester, Winchester, and Worcester; and that the provisions of the first herein-before recited Act should apply to the honorary canonries so founded:

"And whereas the chapters of the several cathedral churches hereinafter enumerated have respectively signified to us their consent to the following regulations, in accordance with the provisions of the said first-recited Act; we, therefore, humbly recommend and propose,

"1. That it shall be lawful for each of the Bishops of Carlisle, Chester, Durham, Ely, Gloucester and Bristol, Norwich, Peterborough, Ripon, Rochester, Winchester, and Worcester, for the time being, forthwith, by instrument under his hand and episcopal seal, to collate any spiritual person, not holding any canonry, honorary canonry, or prebend in any cathedral or collegiate church, to any honorary canonry founded by the said recited Acts, or either of them, in the cathedral churches of Carlisle, Chester, Durham, Ely, Gloucester, Bristol, Norwich, Peterborough, Ripon, Rochester, Winchester, and Worcester, respectively; provided that not more than two such honorary canons shall be appointed in any diocese before the eleventh day of August next, nor more than two in any future year, calculated from that day, except in the case of the vacancy of any

such honorary canonry by death, resignation, or otherwise, and that the total number of such honorary canons in any such church shall never exceed twenty-four:

"2. That every honorary canon when so collated shall be admitted into the cathedral with the same formalities, so far as may be found practicable, as have been heretofore by the practice of such church observed in the admission of a canon or prebendary thereof; and shall, in all processions of the dean and chapter from or to the cathedral church or elsewhere, walk in the order of his seniority determined by the date of his collation, the senior honorary canon taking rank next to the junior canon:

"3. That no fee whatever shall be paid by any such honorary canon, except a fee of ten shillings to the bishop's secretary, upon his collation, and a like fee to the chapter clerk, upon his first admission to the cathedral:

"4. That every such honorary canon shall, when present in the cathedral church, wear the same habit as a canon; and that when neither the dean, sub-dean, nor any canon shall be present during the performance of divine service, the senior honorary canon who shall be present shall perform the same duty as would be performed by the canon in residence, if present:

"5. That in every cathedral church in which any plan for the preaching of the honorary canons therein shall be agreed upon by the dean and chapter, with the consent of their visitor, every honorary canon appointed in the same church shall conform to such plan; provided that he shall not be required so to preach more than once in any year."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the several dioceses of Carlisle, Chester, Durham, Ely, Gloucester and Bristol, Norwich, Peterborough, Ripon, Rochester, Winchester, and Worcester.
