The **QUEEN's** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes in each of the parishes of Astbury and Prestbury, in the county and diocese of Chester.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for

public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend

to your Majesty in Council, that the minister of such district, when duly licenced according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereafter provided:

“And whereas the chapelry of Saint Peter, Congleton, in the said parish of Astbury, and the chapelry of Macclesfield, in the said parish of Prestbury, are, respectively, of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular parts of the said chapelries respectively hereinafter described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted separate districts in manner hereinafter set forth:

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bird Bishop of Chester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said chapelry of Saint Peter, Congleton, described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and therein numbered 1, and all that part of the said chapelry of Macclesfield, in the same schedule also described and numbered 2, all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, respectively, are delineated and set forth in the maps or plans hereunto also annexed, and respectively numbered in like manner, shall be constituted separate districts for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be, respectively, named as follows; that is to say, the district, numbered 1 in the said schedule, shall be named “The District of Saint James, Congleton;” and the district, numbered 2 therein, shall be named “The District of Saint Paul, Macclesfield.”

“And we further recommend and propose, that, in order that the ministers of the districts so recommended to be constituted may be permanently endowed according to the provisions of the said Act, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of each of such districts, when duly licenced according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within either of such districts, being duly licenced by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to the minister for the time being of such district, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within either of such districts shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and in-

habitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sums of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November, as the case may be, next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of either of such districts or new parishes shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish:

“And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority aforesaid, at any time to assign the right of patronage of any such district or new parish as aforesaid, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity, or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole, or to either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion, and in such manner, as shall be approved by the like authority:

“And whereas certain persons have contributed certain sums of money towards providing a church or chapel within the said district of Saint Paul, Macclesfield, and a church or chapel is now in course of erection, by the aid of such monies, within such district; and it has been agreed by such persons that such church or chapel, when completed according to certain plans and a specification which have been submitted to us, shall be offered for approval by us, and for consecration, as the church or chapel of the said district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof; and we have satisfied ourselves, by inspecting such plans and specification, that the said church or chapel, when so completed, will be fit to be so approved and consecrated:

“And whereas certain of the principal contributors to the said church or chapel have, by an

Instrument in writing under their hands, nominated to us the Bishop of Chester, for the time being, as the patron in perpetuity of the said district:

"We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that the right of patronage of the said district of Saint Paul, Macclesfield, and, so soon as the same shall have become a new parish as aforesaid, the right of patronage thereof, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate of such district or new parish, as the case may be, shall be wholly assigned to and absolutely vested in the said John Bird Bishop of Chester, and his successors, Bishops of Chester, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the said parishes or to the said chapelries, or to the said districts or new parishes, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

"No. 1.—The District of SAINT JAMES, CONGLETON, being

"All that part of the chapelry of Saint Peter, Congleton, in the parish of Astbury, in the county and diocese of Chester, situate on the western side of an imaginary line extending eastward, along the river Dane as far as the bridge, over such river, at the northern end of Mill-street, and thence southward, along the middle of such street, and the street called Swan-bank, Wagg-street, Wagg-lane, and Stony-lane, as far as the boundary of the township of Newbold Astbury, in the same county.

"No. 2.—The District of SAINT PAUL, MACCLESFIELD, being

"All that part of the chapelry of Macclesfield, in the parish of Prestbury, and in the said county and diocese of Chester, bounded on the north, by the township of Hurdsfield, on the west, by the river Bollin, on the east, by the township of Rainow, and on the south, by an imaginary line extending towards the south-west, from the western boundary of such last-mentioned township, along the middle of the turnpike road from Macclesfield to Buxton, to a point in the centre of the space where the said road, the old road to Buxton, and the road to Hurdsfield meet, and thence in a straight direction to the north-east corner of the New Town Reservoir, and thence westward, along the northern side of such reservoir and in a straight direction towards the south-west, from the extreme north-western corner thereof, to a point on the eastern side of Knight's Reservoir, opposite to the centre thereof, and thence towards the south-west, along the same side of such last-mentioned reservoir, and westward, along a certain brook running from the same reservoir, as far as the said river Bollin.

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patrons of the churches or chapels of the parishes and chapelries out of which it is intended that the

districts therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, and such incumbents and patrons have respectively consented to the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Chester.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to continue, until the fifth day of April one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, compositions for assessed taxes; and to amend certain laws relating to duties under the management of the Commissioners of Stamps and Taxes.

An Act to amend and explain the Acts, for the commutation of certain manorial rights in respect of lands of copyhold and customary tenure, and in respect of other lands subject to such rights; and for facilitating the enfranchisement of such lands, and for the improvement of such tenure.

An Act to continue, until the end of the session of Parliament next after the thirty-first day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, certain of the allowances of the duty of Excise on soap used in manufactures.

An Act to extend the powers of the Act, for encouraging the establishment of district courts and prisons.

An Act concerning bans and marriages in certain districts, churches, or chapels.

An Act for disfranchisement of the borough of Sudbury.

An Act further to stay, until the end of the next session of Parliament, proceedings in certain actions, under the provisions of several statutes, for the prevention of excessive gaming, and to prevent any similar proceedings being taken under those statutes, during such further limited time.

An Act for better regulating the offices of lecturers and parish clerks.

An Act to extend the powers of the Act, for the appointment and payment of parish constables.

An Act to repeal certain Acts, for regulating the trade in butter and cheese.

An Act to continue, until the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the Act to amend the laws relating to loan societies.

An Act to continue, until the thirty-first day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and to the end of the then next session of Parliament, an Act, of the tenth year of King George the Fourth, for providing for the government of His Majesty's settlements in Western Australia, on the western coast of New Holland.

An Act for the better regulation of colonial posts.

An Act to amend and continue for five years, and to the end of the next session of Parliament, certain Acts relating to linen, hempen, and other manufactures in Ireland.

An Act to confirm and extend the provisions of an Act of the Provincial Parliament of Canada, passed in the seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, for incorporating the Gaspé Fishery and Coal Mining Company.

An Act for making a railway, from the London and Brighton Railway, to Lewes and Hastings, with a branch therefrom, all in the county of Sussex.

An Act for making a railway, from the London and Croydon Railway, at Croydon, to Epsom.

An Act for improving the harbour and quay of Wells, in the county of Norfolk, and for extending and altering some of the provisions of the Act relating to the said harbour and quay.

An Act for lighting, paving, cleansing, widening, and improving the streets of the town or parish of Wells, in the county of Norfolk, for removing and preventing nuisances therein, and for making new streets or road ways.

An Act for incorporating the London Gas Light Company.

An Act for regulating legal proceedings by or against the Mariners' and General Life Assurance Company, and for granting certain powers to the said company.
