THE following Address, from the Corporation of New Windsor, was presented to His Royal Highness Prince Albert, which Address His Royal Highness was pleased to receive very graciously :

To His Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emanuel Duke of Saxe, Prince of Saxe Cobourg Gotha, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, &c. &c. &c.

The Address of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the antient and loyal borough of New Windsor, in the county of Berks, in Council assembled.

May it please your Royal Highness,

WE, Her Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of New Windsor, entreat your Royal Highness to accept our sincere and heartfelt congratulations on the safe delivery of the Queen, and the auspicious birth of a second Prince.

The joyful event of an increase in the illustrious Family of Her Majesty, and the consequent addition to the domestic happiness of our Sovereign and your Royal Highness, is matter for

grateful acknowledgement of the Divine goodness, and will be always regarded by us as further substantial security for the liberties of Her Majesty's free and loyal subjects, and for the stability of the House of Brunswick on the Throne of these realms.

That the Royal Infant, now born amongst us, may daily increase in wisdom and stature, agreeably to the fondest wishes of your Royal Highness's paternal heart; and that, in later days, following the course pointed out to him by the bright example of his Royal Parents, he may be endowed with all their prominent public and private virtues, and prove a worthy scion of the illustrious race from which he is descended, thereby gratifying the fondest hopes of a confiding nation; that Her Majesty and your Royal Highness may long live in the enjoyment of every earthly happiness, and that Her Majesty's reign may continue to be characterized by the devoted and ardent affection of all classes of Her subjects, is our sincere and hearty prayer.

Given under the seal of the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, at a Court of Common Council, held at the Guildhall, in the said borough, on the 14th day of August, in the year of our Lord, 1844, and in the eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.
