

Sugar, the produce of the British possessions, 100 tons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Rice, East India, 10 tons; to be delivered within a fortnight.

All the articles to be exempted from the Customs' duties.

*A sample of the rice (not less than two pounds) must be produced by the parties tendering; and a sample of the sugar, together with the conditions of the contracts, may be seen at the said Office.*

*No tender will be received after one o'clock on the day of treaty, nor any noticed unless the party attends, or an agent for him duly authorized in writing.*
