A^T the Court at Windsor, the 3d day of September 1844,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with " certain modifications, the fourth report of the " Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and " Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirtieth day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act " to carry into effect, with certain modifications, " the fourth report of the Commissioners of " Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," have pre-

pared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for making provision for the spiritual duties of the chapelry districts of Saint John at Seaham-harbour, and Saint Luke at Ferryhill, in the county and diocese of Durham.

"Whereas, under the provisions of the said recited Act, we are empowered, out of the lands, tithes, and hereditaments thereby vested and to be vested in us, or by an actual conveyance thereof, if it shall be deemed more expedient, to make additional provision for the cure of souls in parishes in which such assistance is most required; provided always, that in making any such additional provision out of any tithes or any lands or other hereditaments allotted or assigned in lieu of tithes, so vested or to be vested in us, or out of the rents and profits thereof, due consideration shall be had to the wants and circumstances of the places in which such tithes arise or have arisen :

"And whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-third day of August one thousand eight hundred and fortythree, a district was duly assigned to the church the parish of Dalton-le-Dale, in the said county and diocese of Durham, and the same now forms a separate chapelry district, called and known by the name of Seaham-harbour; and by another Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the fifteenth day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, a district, comprehending the townships of Ferryhill and Chilton, in the parish of Merrington, was duly assigned to the church or chapel of Saint Luke at Ferryhill, and the same now forms a separate chapelry district, called and known by the name of Ferryhill; but the respective ministers of the said churches or chapelries are not perpetual curates or corporations sole :

" And whereas, under the said recited Act, and for the purposes thereof, the rent charge now payable in lieu of the tithes of corn and grain formerly growing, renewing, or arising out of or from all the titheable lands and places within the township of Murton, in the said parish of Dalton-le-Dale, subject to the deductions to be legally made thereout, and also subject to the perpetual annual rent or sum of six pounds thirteen shillings and eleven pence now issuing and payable thereout in respect of the said tithes or rent charge to the said Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Durham, and also the rent charge now payable in lieu of all the tithes or tenths of corn and grain growing, renewing, or arising out of or from all the titheable lands and places within the said township of Ferryhill, in the said parish of Merrington, but subject to the deductions to be legally made thereout, and also subject to the perpetual annual rent or sum of six pounds thirteen shillings and four pence now issuing and payable thereout to the said Dean and Chapter of Durham, have become and now are vested in or payable to us:

" And whereas, after due consideration of the wants and circumstances of the two several parishes of Dalton-le-Dale and Merrington aforesaid, we have deemed it expedient to make provision for the cure of souls therein, by such grant or transfer of the said several and respective rent charges as is hereinafter proposed :

"And whereas it is in contemplation by the said Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Durham aforesaid, by a proper legal instrument to

or chapel of Saint John at Scaham-harbour, in] be duly executed, with our consent as required by the hereinbefore-mentioned Act, to surrender to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne the perpetual annual rents hereinbefore mentioned, to be payable to them out of or in respect of such several tithes, to be applied by the said Governors, under the provisions of the several Acts of Parliament enabling them in that behalf, for the benefit of the ministers for the time being of the said chapelry districts of Seaham-harbour and Ferryhill respectively, in order that the said churches or chapels may thereby become perpetual curacies, and the ministers thereof perpetual curates and as such bodies corporate, and capable of holding to themselves and their successors the several rent charges aforesaid :

> "We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that so soon as by the means aforesaid, or by any other legal means, the said churches or chapelries of Seaham-harbour and Ferryhill shall have respectively become perpetual curacies, and the incumbents thereof for the time being shall have become perpetual curates, the said tithe rent charge, so as aforesaid described to be vested in or payable to us out of the titheable lands of the said township ot Murton, shall, subject to such deductions as aforesaid, without any conveyance or assurance in the law, other than this scheme and any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, become and be absolutely transferred to and vested in the perpetual curate of Seaham-harbour, and his successors for ever, and that the said rent charge, so as aforesaid described to be vested in or payable to us out of the tithes or tenths of the titheable lands of the said township of Ferryhill, shall, subject to the like deductions, become and be in like manner absolutely transferred to and vested in the perpetual curate of Saint Luke at Ferryhill, and his successors for ever.

> " And whereas the provision hereby recommended to be made for the said churches or chapelries was proposed by the said Dean and Chapter, and agreed to by us, in contemplation of and previously to the date of the assignment of the respective districts aforesaid:

> "We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, to the ministers for the time being of the said churches or chapelries respectively, on the first day of No-

wember next, a sum of money equal in amount to such portions of the said rent charges respectively. after deducting all outgoings in respect thereof, as may have accrued to us from the dates of the respective. Orders aforesaid to the said first day of November, and thereafter, on each and every first day of May and first day of November, until the said tithe rent charges shall have respectively become so vested as aforesaid, and also, on the day of such vesting, a sum of money equal in amount to such portions of the said rent charges respectively, after like deductions, as may have accrued between the said respective days of payment; and that if any vacancy in either of the said churches or chapelries shall happen, before such vesting of the said tithe rent charges respectively, on any other day than the first day of November or first day of May, or the day of such vesting, the then next payment shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister making the vacancy, or his representatives, and the minister succeeding to the church or chapelry so becoming vacant:

" And we further recommend and propose, thatnothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters herein contained, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act."

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been duly given to the Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Durham, and no objection has been made thereto :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same shall take effect immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the last recited Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Durham.

> Railway Department, Board of Trade, Whitehall, 19th September 1844.

REFERRING to the notice in the Gazette of of the 23d August, announcing the intention of the Railway Board to examine into certain schemes therein enumerated, with a view to the presentation to Parliament of minutes or reports thereon, in the event of their becoming the subjects of application to Parliament, the Board hereby give notice, that it is further their intention to examine, with a similar view, into the following schemes, viz.

- I. The schemes proposed for connecting Portsmouth with London, by more direct lines of railway communication.
- **H.** The Richmond and West End Junction, and other schemes for forming a central terminus in the neighbourhood of Waterloo and Hungerford bridges.

The principal points into which enquiry will be made, in connection with the above schemes, are as follows:

- 1st. The ability and *bong fide* intention of the promoters to prosecute their application to Parliament next session for Bills to authorise the several undertakings.
- 2d. The advantages to be obtained, in a national point of view, in completing or extending important lines of railway communication.
- 3d. The amount of local advantage afforded to the towns and districts more immediately affected.
- 4th The engineering circumstances of the line, so far as may be necessry to form a general judgment of the character of the undertaking.
- 5th. The estimates of cost of construction, and of traffic and working expenses, so far as may be necessary to judge of the probability of the line being completed and efficiently worked, in the event of its being sanctioned by Parliament, and with a view to drawing a comparison between the merit of competing lines of railway.

The inquiry, in conformity with the recommendation of the fifth report of the Select Committee on Railways, will not embrace questions of private property or interest, which will be reserved altogether for the consideration of the Legislature.

"Whereas there was this day read at the Board a report of the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Council, appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to trade and foreign plantations, dated the 15th day of August last, in the words following, viz.

- ^c The Lords of your Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council having been pleased by their Order, bearing date the 12th instant, to refer unto this Committee a letter from the Secretary to the Corporation of Trinity-House of Deptford Strond, submitting, on behalf of the said Corporation, for the consent of your Majesty, the following proposition:
- That all vessels, of less burthen than fifteen tons, be exempted from payment of tolls to the Corporation of Trinity-House of Deptford Strond;
- ⁶ The Lords of this Committee, having taken the said proposal into consideration, humbly take leave to report as their opinion to your Majesty, that the same should receive your Majesty's royal approbation.'

"Her Majesty, having taken the said report into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that all vessels, of less burthen than fifteen tons, be exempted from payment of tolls to the Corporation of Trinity-House of Deptford Strond; whereof, all persons whom it may concern are to take notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
