And it is also intended by the same Act or Acts, to authorize the construction and maintenance of a branch railway, with all proper works, approaches, and conveniences connected therewith; diverging from and out of the main line of the said intended railway, in the place or parish called Markshall otherwise Marketshall, in the county of Norfolk, or in the parish of Lakenham, in the county of the city of Norwich, and terminating by a junction with the Norwich and Brandon Railway, at or near Carrow-abbey, in the hamlet or hamlets of Trowse Carrow and Bracondale, or one of them, in the said county of the city of Norwich; which said intended branch railway, and other works connected therewith, will pass from, in, through, or into, or be situate
